ALLOTMENTS ARE IN

One of the very few duties that a parish council must carry out is to provide allotments. Over the years there has been a huge reduction in the number of allotments in the village but for at least the last twenty years even the remaining area behind Church Lane has had unused plots. <u>Until now that is</u>.


While we celebrate the increase in interest and also the general pattern of better use of all the plots, we have to be concerned about the fact that there are now 6 people on the **waiting list**. Given the substantial difficulties that would be experienced in expanding the area of allotments, the PC has had to look more closely at the tenancy agreement and to be more active in the management of the existing area.

The PC cannot do anything about carrot fly, drought or blight, but are obliged to be concerned about the extent to which allotments are cultivated and the fair and orderly change of tenants.

Whilst personal arrangements between family and friends can be well intentioned, the PC has to try to ensure that those reaching the top of the waiting list are offered plots as they become available.

The PC is proposing to hold a **meeting at 7.30pm on Monday 8th September in the Caudwell Day Centre** for all allotment holders, for those on the waiting list and for those who are thinking that having an allotment might be a good idea some time in the near future.

We hope to have a useful exchange of views so that everybody interested in this subject - including the PC - will have a better understanding of how the provision of allotments could be managed in the future. *Daniel Scharf* (for Parish Council)

The choir vestry window has been repaired (see pic p8) and the lightning conductor has been fitted. The rewiring of the church will take place during the first three weeks of October. The church will be **closed during that time** but we can use the church room.

To keep the church in good order we need to do more than keep it in good repair. A dedicated team of volunteers do such things as:- clock-winding, flower arranging, cleaning, washing linen, maintaining the churchyard, etc. People ring the bells, sing in the choir and play the music. It is the combined efforts of such people that make St Peter's the well-loved place it is, able to offer a warm welcome every day of the week.

At our **Harvest Festival on 28 September** we will take the opportunity to give thanks for keeping the church in good order. This includes the current work done & in progress, but also includes those volunteers who keep it so well on a regular basis.

Invitations have gone out to <u>everyone in the village</u> as we would like to include you all in our harvest and thanksgiving celebrations. You may not come to the church on a regular basis, but perhaps <u>this is an opportunity to join us for this celebration</u>.

OCTABUS DIAL-A-RIDE

Residents of the parish may not be aware that a dial-a-ride service for **disabled and mobility-impaired people** operates in this area. Called Octabus, the service operates Mondays to Fridays between 9am and 5pm, and provides a door-to-door service for people who are unable to use, or who find it difficult to use conventional public transport.

To use the service you have to be a scheme member, but this costs just a one-off membership fee of £5. Fares are charged, but concessionary bus passes are accepted, so for most if not all Octabus users the journey will be free. To book the Octabus service you just phone 01865 876176 up to seven days before your journey. Octabus can be used for any sort of journey except for hospital appointments or journeys to County Council run Social Centres.

Information about Octabus is available from the telephone number above, or from libraries, or from County or District Council offices. Octabus is funded by Oxfordshire County Council and Oxford City Council, Vale of White Horse District Council, and West Oxfordshire District Council.

The councils that make up Octabus are currently reviewing the service (which has run since April 2005), as they are considering a new contract for the service from next April, when the current contract runs out. Local Parish Councils are amongst those being consulted, so if you have any views about the Octabus service, or about dial-a-ride in general, **please let your parish council know** before the consultation deadline of 22nd September.




