PARISH THE THOUGHT - & CHERISH THE BUS

A quick update on the elections on May 5 for **your parish councillors** for the next 4 years. There will be no parish election. Only 7 people put themselves forward for the 11 seats.

As somebody who has been on the Council for the last 8 years I have no way of knowing whether this is a sign of satisfaction in the way in which the Council is being run, or residents feel that the parish council is not relevant to life in the village. I am not sure that the latter stands up to examination given the number of people who have benefited from grants made to organisations involving residents, or from the burial ground and allotments.

There is some evidence that residents expect litter to be picked and it is very important that play equipment is provided and kept in good working order. Walkers and horse riders will appreciate their rights of way being protected. There is currently a consultation on the subsidised buses serving the village.

Fortunately the opportunity to become a parish councillor does not end on 5 May as vacancies can be filled through a relatively painless process of co-option. The next time to **see the PC in action** is at its AGM (see page 9) when you can get a sense of whether you might have something to offer. There is a minimum commitment to one evening meeting per month - normally first Monday. Or you could always speak to somebody who has been a parish councillor (including me – **Daniel Scharf** - tel 531107).

The County Council are considering what to do with the **subsidised bus services**:- the 32B&C running in the evenings between Abingdon and Didcot, and the Sunday X2 service.

The numbers of users is low, and therefore a high subsidy per passenger. This is not a good picture when money is tight.

Residents have until 3 June to send their questions or views to tim.darch@oxfordshire.gov.uk. There's a public meeting in Grove Village Hall on 12 May (Thurs) from 2pm to 5pm or come and tell the Parish Council (May 16th) what you are thinking.

For example, the Council need to know if you would be more likely to use the Oxford to Drayton service in the evenings if the journey was not broken in Abingdon, or if you will be relying on buses more in the future (including Sundays) as fuel prices increase. As with all public services, **if we do not use it we will lose it** - at a time when some people are dependent on these buses.

On Picking & Choosing

Elections are all about choices. Much of the media would have it that the choices are simple. This lot cannot be trusted or that lot is beyond the pale. Much of the campaign advertising plays the same game. 'We want our troops to have decent safety equipment, we don't want AV' or 'The BNP are voting No – are you?'

All this insults the electors' intelligence. With falling newspaper readership (particularly amongst the young), and rapid communication via the internet – people are becoming better and more quickly informed of all the issues. They are ever-more able to spot when the wool is being pulled over their eyes – it seems that the politicians, the media and the campaign organisers are getting seriously behind.

The problem is, that with better, faster and more complete information on which to base our decisions, making our minds up becomes ever harder. Nothing seems simple any longer. We no longer quite trust what we are being told. We are no longer content to be told what to think. Decisions which seemed simple a generation ago, we now recognise as being fiendishly complicated.

Political Parties have policies on hundreds of issues. Manifestos are like telephone directories – and more often as not, about as entertaining. Do we reject a party because we do not like its position on this or that? Which are the issues that most matter to us? These are difficult and big decisions but our ancestors went through hell to give us our right to make them.

Luckily, the elections on May 5thh are reasonably straightforward, although the media will try to make them complicated if they think it serves their purpose. Local District Elections are just that – LOCAL – do we trust this lot or that lot to make the best local decisions? Who has been doing the job? Would another lot do it better? These elections are not about Libya, or the National Health Service or Student Fees. They are about Waste collection, Planning and local communities.

Please when you make your choice on May 5th, and yes, **please** do exercise your right to make a choice, make it on local issues.

PARISH COUNCIL (April 4)

In addition to the Parish Councillors and our 2 County Councillors, 18 members of the public attended the Annual Parish Assembly. Daniel Scharf read his Chairman's Report covering matters dealt with over the past year. These included the outcome of the public enquiry into Thames Water's proposals for the new Reservoir, namely that TW were deemed not to have demonstrated a need for new water resources on anything like the scale originally planned. Daniel paid tribute to GARD, who at their own expense took on opponents with vastly greater financial resources, yet by virtue of sound research and argument, were able to expose the flaws in Thames Water's case.

Other issues were the long-running (ongoing) saga of the Earl of Plymouth Estates (Manor Farm) development, the Drayton Community Plan, and the new Localism Bill and its possible implications for planning and further new developments.

Parish Councillors serve for a four-year term, which comes to an end this year with the May 5th elections. Daniel therefore thanked the councillors and our relatively new but highly efficient Clerk, David Perrow for their past efforts and noted that David has already initiated a number of improvements in the Council.

It should be added that, although several of the present councillors intend to stand again on May 5th, there will continue to be vacancies on the Parish Council after that date. The closing date for nominations for election has passed, but the new Parish Council will have the power to co-opt councillors to make up our full complement of 11. In short, interested parties please come along and join us!

>>> Reports were also given by chairmen of each working group, and our County Councillors, Mike and Marilyn Badcock. Items of note included the following:- from the Finance Committee, various grants have been made to local bodies and organisations, and £15,000 has been set aside this year for a Recreation Project, which will hopefully be used to upgrade part of the children's playground in Lockway.

From the Rights of Way and Conservation Working Group, Jenny Pooley reported that an oak tree has been planted on the Millennium Green in memory of Norman Stimpson, who was a member of the Parish Council for 32 years, and also served Drayton in many other ways.

At the entrance to the Millennium Green from Sutton Wick Lane, an area of hard-standing has been laid where there was once a muddy rutted space, making for a much-improved appearance. In some other areas, such as traffic calming for the eastern end of the High Street, and making the slope from the Rook's Nest path less hazardous, progress is slow (as described last month), but not for the want of trying.

A matter of some concern, which was raised by two residents in the Annual Parish Assembly, is that the Kiln Lane bridleway is now being used by some vehicles as a road, since the laying of a hard surface by the developer of the new houses in Kiln Lane. It was pointed out that this is dangerous for the pedestrians and dogwalkers who use the bridleway on a regular basis. The Parish Council has undertaken to investigate, and work with VWHDC Planning Department and OCC's Environment Department to try to resolve the problem.

5 other members of the public spoke on behalf of their respective organisations:- Alan Alston for the Drayton Football Club; Andrew Gould for the Damascus Project; Tom Oliver for the Drayton Almshouses; Michael Bell for the Twinning Project; and Andrew Bax for the Drayton Community Trust.

Due to the local elections on May 5th, the **next Parish Council meeting** (the first meeting of the new Council) will be <u>later in the month than usual</u>, on **Monday 16th May** 2011, at 7.30pm, in the Caudwell Day Centre, Gravel Lane. As ever, <u>all are welcome</u> to attend. **Richard Williams**

GARDENING TIME (Sara Southey)

Are you looking at your garden in all its glory and wondering why one or two plants that should be growing don't seem to be? Several in mine look like they've reached the end. It's been a hard winter for our plants and some, inevitably, haven't survived. By this time you should be able to see some kind of growth on all of them enabling you to know whether they're alive or dead. It may just be buds at the base or some green showing in the centre, but enough on close examination to say it's still alive.


One quick way of finding out if it's completely dead is by snapping or cutting dead looking branches. Starting at the tip, carefully cut or snap above a bud. If it snaps off easily or looks completely brown on the inside when you cut it then you can be sure it's dead. Carefully, keep snapping down until it doesn't give easily or when you cut the inside is a different colour to the outside, sometimes, greeny yellow, sometimes a lighter brown. By doing this you can see if the plant is still alive or completely dead.

Once you've established the plant is completely dead, dig it out and remove as much of the root ball as possible so you can replace it. If it's still alive but looks like it's struggling, prune back any damaged branches/shoots and give it a good feed with some general purpose fertiliser and ensure it doesn't lack water.

In fact, since our Springs seem to be taking on a hot dry aspect, it's really important to ensure that all your plants have enough water. This includes vegetable patches, anything in pots or newly planted. Most people water when they first plant something, but then forget. Newly planted stuff is particularly vulnerable, until a plant's roots have stretched from its original compost base and fully integrated with the surrounding soil the plant is very vulnerable to any kind of water shortage.

Anything newly planted or that has been damaged by frost, cold or heavily pruned needs water and food until it is established and flourishing. So, even in Spring time, when everything seems able to cope on its own, keep an eye on these weak plants and ensure they are watered and fed regularly to encourage good strong growth to enable them to survive a hard winter. The work we do now should pay off once the cold winters draw in. So invest in your plants now so they can bank enough energy to draw on when times get harsh. Happy Gardening!

<u>Wooden Spoon Recipe</u> No. 39 (from March '03) by Lois Rennells <u>Orange Chutney excellent with Curry</u>

2 chopped shallots, 1 peeled and chopped cooking apple, 2 large oranges (about 1 lb weight), 1 teaspoon salt, 6 fluid oz light vinegar, 4 oz sultanas, ½ teaspoon ground coriander, ½ teaspoon paprika, ½ teaspoon finely chopped fresh ginger, ½ lb sugar.

Simmer the shallots in a little water until soft. Add the apple and simmer until soft. Grate the rind of the oranges. Remove all the pith from the oranges and discard. Either chop or mince the orange flesh and reserve the juice. Add the orange rind, flesh and juice, the salt, 3 fl oz of the vinegar, the sultanas, coriander, paprika and ginger and simmer until the orange peel is tender (½ to ¾ hour).

Finally add the remaining 3 fl oz of vinegar and the sugar. Stir until the sugar dissolves then cook until thick stirring from time to time (about 20 to 30 minutes). Pot and seal.




