PARISH COUNCIL REPORT Richard Williams

Report of the Drayton Parish Council meeting held on Monday 1st August 2011

This was the best attended meeting of the Parish Council in many months, with some 28 members of the public coming along to put their views and ask questions. A good number of those people were residents of Lockway, responding to the proposal to use the field between Lockway and the A34 as a recreation area. It would be fair to say that some trenchant views were expressed, most of them unfavourably disposed towards any development of the field. As an immediate response, this was not altogether surprising. Although the Parish Council wrote to all the residents directly affected – i.e. those whose gardens back onto the field in question, the proposed development had not been previously canvassed, and who amongst us would not be ambivalent (at least) about such changes taking place in, almost literally, our own back yard? In the circumstances, a degree of instinctive hostility was perhaps to be expected.

It should be said here that the offer of this land came out of the blue to the Parish Council at a recent meeting with representatives of the Earl of Plymouth Estates. This is why, in turn, the proposal has been somewhat sprung on the village, and Lockway residents in particular. But the Parish Council thought it necessary to get some sense of public opinion on the matter as soon as possible. As explained last month, the Parish Council takes the view that Drayton lacks the recreational facilities to be found in other villages of comparable size (e.g. Steventon), and has tried for many years to address that deficiency. The stumbling blocks have always been the same: either there is no suitable land available, or there is suitable land, but the owner is not willing to sell.

The offer from the EoP Estate presents, at last, a potential way forward, which is why the Parish Council is keen to explore the possibilities for development.

9, The Green, Drayton, OX14 4JA 01235 531359 The PC is aware that the Lockway site is not ideal: the practical problems of noise from the A34; access and parking; and drainage, amongst others, would all need to be tackled. The actual size of the area being offered is still subject to negotiation and will have a bearing on its viability for the proposed use. Lockway's residents have legitimate concerns and their views will obviously be listened to carefully. But the Parish Council has to take account of other residents as well, especially among the younger age groups, who would welcome additional recreational facilities in the village. No project can proceed without overall support from the community and there is a task ahead to ascertain exactly what Drayton as a whole would want.

One thing which did become apparent from the meeting is that there are not just disagreements over issues in the village (it would be unusual if there were not) but very different views as to what a village should be. There is clearly a debate to be had on this subject, especially as the government's forthcoming Localism Act is thought to contain new arrangements for local planning which would bring together parish councils and 'neighbourhood forums'. A separate article on the role of village life in the Big Society suggests itself – perhaps one for a future issue? For the moment, as space is limited, it should be noted that several other serious discussions took place at this meeting, including the ongoing problems with misuse of the Kiln Lane bridleway, and PCSO Chris Cochrane's report on his experiences dealing with antisocial behaviour in South Abingdon. Details of these will be held over to next month's report.

The next Parish Council meeting will be on Monday 5th September 2011, at 7.30pm, in the Caudwell Day Centre in Gravel Lane. As always, all are invited to attend.

BLUE PLAQUES FOR DRAYTON?

The first Blue Plaque Scheme was established in London in 1866 and has inspired many similar schemes across the UK and further afield including the Oxfordshire Blue Plaques Scheme which was founded in 1999. The scheme promotes recognition and awareness of people, places and events that have been of lasting significance in the life of Oxfordshire or more widely.

If you know of a Drayton person, place or event that merits a Blue Plaque and fits the criteria of the scheme as detailed below, then please contact the Public Relations & Press Working Group of Drayton Parish Council via the following email address, draytonclerk@yahoo.co.uk and they will be very happy to assist you in completing the Proposal.

A list of all Oxfordshire Blue plaques, short biographies or accounts of the subjects can be found on the website at www.oxfordshireblueplaques.org.uk.

These are the factors you need to consider;

- The main point of the scrutiny is to ensure that the person, place or event commemorated is of lasting and clear significance.
- The person must have been dead for at least 20 years (exceptions may be considered in rare cases, e.g. if the centenary of the person's birth has passed).
- The person must be demonstrably eminent in a public sphere and/or otherwise had an impact or done work worthy of lasting recognition.
- They must have lived or worked in the building on which the plaque will be erected for at least five years.
- The plaque must be visible to the public.
- When a location or particular building is proposed for recognition by a Blue Plaque it must be locally or nationally known to be of special significance and worthy of lasting recognition.
- At least 20 years must have elapsed before an event can be recognised by a Blue Plaque.

LETTER FROM ST PETER'S

PACT Centenary Fund

Dear Friends,

Have you heard of the Oxford Diocesan charity Parents And Children Together which this year celebrates its centenary? Started in 1911 by the then-Bishop of Oxford with a £100 donation, the charity began with one social worker riding her bike round impoverished streets helping extremely poor children. Over the years, the charity became known as PACT and has helped thousands of families and children overcome parenting problems.

In the 1950s, PACT began adoption work and is now a highly respected international Adoption & Fostering Agency. Nowadays adoption is rarely of young babies, but instead deals with older children very badly treated from an early age, whose life chances might otherwise be pretty slim unless they can be offered skilled therapies to counteract the damage they have suffered, within a new context of loving understanding family life and PACT's help.

Working in communities, PACT runs many Children's Centres under Local Authority contracts, several of them in VWHDC and SODC - Abingdon, Berinsfield, Didcot, Wallingford, Wantage and Witney. These drop-in centres offer a helping hand for those facing parenting problems, with "dirty-&-wet" play sessions so difficult for a young mum in a cramped flat, support after bereavement, nutrition & health education, and friendship for preschool parents who can become isolated. Novel ideas are considered and implemented if at all practical - for example SaturDads which links out-of-touch fathers with their young children while remaining "cool".

An innovative PACT Scheme, recently nominated for a Howard League for Penal Reform award, is Alana House in Reading. In this strictly-women's-only centre, PACT works with women referred by the Courts to get them organized, take the chaos out of their lives and access supportive services. An initial estimate of Alana House's value to the community is £34million a year in economic and social savings at an annual running cost of under £200,000. The value to women in regaining their lives is beyond calculation in monetary terms.

As Patron of PACT the Bishop of Oxford has asked every parish to raise £100 to recognise PACT's first 100 years and to establish a PACT Centenary Fund for future work. The Diocesan Motorbike Rally collecting the various donations will call at St.Peter's in Drayton on Tuesday 13th September. motorbike riders could come for a PhotoCall at 11.15am, they would be very welcome! 

GARD UPDATE Nick Thompson

There will be a lull in the news about the Thames Water plans while the company does the essential work and research as ordered by the Secretary of State following the outcome of the Public Inquiry which found that the proposed 100 million cubic metre Abingdon reservoir plan was "not fit for purpose".

A revised plan is expected to be announced by the company at the end of the year. It may include a half size reservoir but there are several other options to fill the modest supply shortfall. Whatever is announced will only be a stop-gap. Thames Water is obliged to do a great deal more work before the 2014 plan comes out, and that is the important one now. At a recent meeting with Thames Water and the Environment Agency, GARD's experts made it clear that they would hold the company to account and monitor the water transfer and re-use work to ensure it is properly and transparently carried out by the appointed consultants engaged by the company.

DISEASE AFFECTING LOCAL BIRDS

Evidence of a disease called Trichomonosis that can be fatal to garden birds has been seen locally. The following is an extract from RSPB advice on the problem.

Trichomonosis in finches and other garden birds

Large numbers of greenfinches are dying of a disease called trichomonosis

Since summer 2005, trichomonosis, a disease caused by a microscopic parasite has been reported in finches in gardens. Since then, outbreaks have been seen every year during the late summer and autumn.

Greenfinch populations have been recorded dropping by a third, and chaffinch populations by a fifth in heavily-affected areas. Sparrows, indeed all birds, can also be affected.

What happens?

The trichomonad parasite lives in the upper digestive tract of the bird, and its actions progressively block the bird's throat, making it unable to swallow food. The bird dies from starvation.

Birds with the disease show signs of general illness, for example lethargy and fluffed-up plumage, but affected birds may also drool saliva, regurgitate food, have difficulty in swallowing or show laboured breathing.

Finches are frequently seen to have matted, wet plumage around the face and beak, and uneaten food in and around the beak. In some cases, swelling of the neck may be seen from a distance.

How is it passed on?

The trichomonad parasite is vulnerable to drying out and cannot survive for long periods outside the host. Transmission of infection between birds happens when they feed one another with regurgitated food during the breeding season, and through food or drinking water contaminated with recently regurgitated saliva.

What can I do?

If evidence of trichomonosis is found, it is recommended to stop putting out food for 4 to 6 weeks and leave bird baths dry until sick or dead birds are no longer found in the garden.

If dead birds have not been found, water and food may be provided, but it would be sensible to disinfect seed-feeders and baths daily.

(Editor's note: Bottle brushes are apparently good for cleaning out cylindrical bird feeders, Vickery's shop sell bottle brushes of a suitable size. The RSPB also stock a range of cleaning tools)
