Parish Council - Heather Morrison

The PC has just lost the services of Heather Morrison who started on the council in 1996 and has continued despite leaving the village while her children attended Drayton School.

By serving 16 years(!) Heather provided the continuity which is needed to keep track of matters which span the election of 4-year terms. **She also set an extraordinary example** of giving time and energy during a period when the PC has been shorthanded.

For the last ten years Heather was both vice-chairman and chair of planning. Not only has she coordinated the comments made on hundreds of planning applications but has also been closely involved in the extremely complex issue of the housing development in the centre of the village (at Manor Farm where the barn conversions have been completed but the 20 houses and access arrangements have not started).

With Heather leaving, the PC (now with 4 vacancies) has on average become even older and more male dominated, which might give certain sections of the village food for thought.

Accordingly (& with Nov 5th not so very far away), here's a brief note from Thames Valley Police of what the law is on this topic (& has been for a few years).

It is <u>against the law</u> to:- a) set off or throw fireworks in the street or other public place, and b) set off fireworks between <u>11.00 pm & 7.00 am</u> – except during certain celebrations (**see below).

If found guilty by the courts, you could be **fined up to** £5,000 and can be imprisoned for up to three months. You may be liable for an on-the-spot fine of £80.

** **Bonfire Night, the time limit is midnight**, and for New Year's Eve, Diwali (you'd need to be Hindu), and Chinese New Year, that gets extended to 1 am.



Inspired by the Olympics - 1

Dear Ollie (Ollie Toogood, of 'England Athletics'),

This (nationwide Athletics Community Day promotion) was a great idea and we really enjoyed it. It felt amazing to continue the legacy of the games. I was very proud of my runners and all the new people who came along and made both event great fun. I'm very pleased to be part of this wonderful athletics family.

I held two Athletics Community Days, Weds Aug 15th was in Drayton and Tues 14th in Sutton Courtenay; I only had 4 days to advertise, so the numbers were limited to 8 and 10. We had 5 new people attend, two of whom would like to return to the weekly running club, 3 are currently too young but inspired. We had 3 children and one (regular) lady who is 5 months pregnant running with us; the atmosphere was fun, relaxed and (for me) memorable.

After our warm-up lap we did our first 2 events, 'beat Bolt'. On a 100m track we tried to run as far as we could in the same time as Usain Bolt ran 100m. I had measured out the track so that people could see how far they could get. Medals were awarded for the furthest runner. The second event was Bolt's favourite 200m. Participants had two attempts at this. Most of us, despite being runners, couldn't reach the 100m line, let alone the 200m!

The third and final event was for us to see how hard it would be to run 5km in the time that the winning male and female Olympic competitor did it. We had teams of either 4 or 5 and ran only 100m each in relay. Even with fresh legs each 100m our best time was 17.5 minutes, a full 2 minutes slower than the winning ladies, who took only a little over 15 minutes. Mo Farah did the whole thing himself in a little over 13 minutes. Although we ran only in small chunks, we excused ourselves on the basis that he wasn't carrying a baby and had 22 years on our youngest runner. It really brought home how amazing these athletes are to run so fast for so long.

"I enjoyed the 5,000m best, it was brilliant and I want to do it again tomorrow" (Joshua, age 9). "My favourite part was winning the Mandeville cuddly mascot" (Heather, age 7).

"I think I'm going to be sick" (Barry, didn't feel right to ask an adult his age!). Followed later by, "what type of thing do you normally do at the running club? I'm available Tuesdays".

Thanks to Ollie and England Athletics for this great idea. Please let me know what you have lined up next. We want to be part of it.

WESTMINSTER VIEW

Ed Vaizey's column (Wantage & Didcot MP, also he's Minister of Culture, Communications and Creative Industries)

This month I've received many emails on a great variety of subjects, especially House of Lords reform and the Government's inquiry into banking. I've also continued to receive emails about the consultation on redefining marriage and I've received about 100 on many other issues, including regional NHS pay, Trident, dog on guide dog attacks and the Finance Bill. But no issue has compared with Air Passenger Duty, over 180 emails and letters.

Following successful campaigns in Drayton and Marcham to have school transport reinstated, I met pupils and teachers from Cholsey and Wallingford Schools to see for myself the road that some children will have to walk to school if free school buses are withdrawn as threatened. Having walked the route, it cannot be described as safe, cars speed past, the footpath is incredibly narrow, and just one moment of inattention and there could be a serious accident. The County Council has to look at this again, and I will continue to press for them to reverse this decision too.

I recently had a very educational day in the constituency, when I visited both Stockham Primary School in Wantage, and Ladygrove Primary School in Didcot. Both are assessed as 'Outstanding' by Ofsted, and both are fantastic examples of just how good education can be with the right leadership. The children I met at both schools were bright, confident and very keen to tell me about their favourite lessons. At Stockham School, I was also privileged to meet Tamsin England, who uses communication aids provided with the help of the ACE Centre in Oxford, which helps many people with a variety of disabilities to communicate using the latest technology. It was threatened with closure, but funding has been allocated, saving the Centre so Tamsin can really benefit from the same educational opportunities as her friends in class. All in all, it was great to see how the latest technology can be used to such good effect. >>>>

PARISH COUNCIL (August 6th)

Several members of the public and County Councillor Mike Badcock attended the meeting in addition to the Parish Councillors. Daniel Scharf informed everyone that Heather Morrison, the Vice-Chairman of the PC, and Chair of its Planning Committee, had finally decided to resign after 16 years of dedicated service, which she has had to juggle with family commitments and a very demanding and responsible job.

Heather will be much missed on the Council and the PC hopes to show its appreciation more formally in the near future. Mike Badcock also commended Heather for her long contribution to the PC's work and stated that she exemplified all the best qualities one would hope to find in a Parish Councillor.

Heather is a hard act to follow; nevertheless posts have to be filled, and so Daniel Scharf (Chairman) also becomes Chair of Planning, Laurence Zipson now joins the Planning Committee, and Richard Williams takes over from Heather as Vice-Chair.

There are now four vacancies on the PC, so the usual invitation goes out – please come and join us, at what could be, with the Neighbourhood Plan, an exciting time for Drayton over the next couple of years.

Cyril Carter, who lives in Steventon Road, near the council waste disposal facility, reported that in summers past, it had been his habit to carry some of his garden waste on foot to the tip, since it seemed pointless to drive such a short distance. Recently however, he had been informed by a worker at the facility that this practice was no longer permitted, and in fact a sign stating 'No Pedestrians' has been posted at the entrance to the tip. Mr Carter wondered why it had been necessary to introduce such a measure.

From the ensuing discussion it would appear that the main reason is that some motorists were deliberately parking in Steventon Road, outside the tip, in an effort to avoid the queues that build up at weekends and other busy times. This caused obstructions on the main road, and if an increasing number of drivers continued to carry their rubbish onto the site, walking on the same access roads as vehicles entering and leaving the tip, clearly at some point there could be an accident, possibly serious. Mr Carter accepted this explanation, although it would seem that genuine pedestrians, such as himself, have been penalised by the actions of a few irresponsible motorists abusing the system. $\rightarrow >>>$

>>> A complaint was made by one of the neighbours of a proposed housing development off Chiers Drive, which would replace an existing large house with three smaller dwellings. There were concerns about design and access, with particular reference to the anticipated increase in the number of cars using a narrow access road.

Members of the Parish Council's Planning Committee confirmed that they had seen and commented on the application. It was noted that some of the statements made by the developers appeared to be misleading, and the committee shared some of the residents' reservations about the development. However, having some awareness of the criteria applied by Vale planners, the PC felt that the objections made would not necessarily be considered by them as sufficient grounds to refuse the development.

Antonia Seymour was critical of some of the information in the July Chronicle concerning the proposed Neighbourhood Plan. She believed that elements of it were tendentious, and gave the impression that some decisions, for example, as to housing sites, had already been made. It was explained that this is not the case, and that indeed it would be pointless to proceed on that basis, since the Plan can only be adopted if it secures approval of a majority of Drayton residents, as expressed in a referendum. Comments and captions on the pull-out village map, or elsewhere in the Chronicle, should be understood as being illustrative only, and intended to spark debate on a project which it is hoped will involve as many willing volunteers as possible.

This will be the last issue of the Chronicle before the official launch of the Neighbourhood Plan, and therefore, in addition to any other information that may be included this month about that event, I should again **remind everyone** that the launch evening is **Friday September 7**th at the Village Hall at 7pm, and that there will be further follow-up activities over the Saturday and Sunday for those who wish to be involved, in however extensive or modest a way, in helping to shape the future of Drayton village!

To contact any members of the Parish Council, all enquiries should be directed to the Parish Clerk, David Perrow, in the first instance. David may be contacted by telephone on 07909 176061, or via E-mail at draytonclerk@yahoo.co.uk, and he will ensure that any messages are passed on.

Any Drayton resident may also ask to be added to the <u>Clerk's E-mailing list</u>, so that they receive prior notice of meetings and any relevant documents. In addition, all Parish Council minutes are now archived on the village website: www.drayton-near-abingdon.org. The latter also carries back copies of the Drayton Chronicle and details of other events in the village.

The next Parish Council meeting will be on Monday 3rd September (i.e. prior to the launch of the Neighbourhood Plan), at 7.30pm in the Caudwell Centre, Gravel Lane. **As always, all are welcome**.

GARDENING TIME

Living Architecture :- Ask anyone to name an ornamental grass and the response is usually 'Pampas Grass', now despised by many as these magnificent grasses were allowed to grow to immense and uncontrollable proportions. Smaller varieties of the beautiful Cortaderia are now available though and hopefully they will find favour again as eye-catching specimen plants. However, there are other smaller, ornamental grasses on offer which are suitable for most gardens whether planted in borders or tubs.

These under-rated plants have superb architectural qualities, provide a touch of the exotic and are relatively low maintenance. They are truly desirable additions to gardens, offering spectacular displays through the year, are trouble-free and fantastic to soften hard landscaping. The taller varieties are wonderful for sensory environments, giving movement and sound as the breeze moves the leaves. Shorter grasses are suitable for containers or the fronts of borders. Grasses can be used as ground cover plants, as focal points in the garden, in soil erosion control projects, naturalistic garden designs and modern planting schemes. The foliage not only provides interest for the best part of the year but the airy flower plumes create colour and contrast from summer to winter.

There are 2 types of grasses to choose from: cool season and warm season. Cool season grasses show signs of life in early spring and can often retain their foliage throughout the winter provided there isn't an arctic blast of freezing air. Drought conditions can force the grasses into dormancy resulting in unattractive brown foliage. However, the plants will perk up with the help of water. The majority of cool season grasses are clumpforming, meaning they will need to be divided every few years. Varieties to look for include Deschampsia, Festuca & Sesleria.

The warm season grasses throw up small green shoots in spring but they do not retain their green foliage during the winter. The leaves and feathery flower spikes turn to shades of cream, bronze, gold and chestnut as autumn progresses to winter, providing colour and vertical form in the dormant garden. The fluffy seed heads provide food for visiting birds and the dense, crisp foliage provides cover for small mammals. As with cool season grasses, most are clump-forming and will need to be split over time. Warm season grasses include Miscanthus, Panicum and Pennisetum.

When selecting grasses, choose the right one for the location. Warm season grasses tend to be taller, plant accordingly, either as specimens or in drifts, combining heights and textures for a more natural effect. Grasses will create greater impact if they catch the morning or evening sunlight, also combine well with summer and autumn-flowering herbaceous plants like Cephalaria, Crocosmia, Echinacea, Helenium, Kniphofia, Leucanthemum and Verbena as well as shrubs such as Aucuba and Elaeagnus.

Once established, most ornamental grasses require very little attention except for a spring clean and division as needed. New plants should be watered thoroughly and frequently throughout the first growing season. By the following year, the roots should be well established thus reducing the need for irrigation unless drought conditions prevail.

In early spring, cut the dried stems back. Small clumps are easy to prune with shears and secateurs but larger clumps may require the use of a handsaw. Divide the clumps every few years in order to ensure the health of the plant. If the outer part of the plant shows signs of growth but not the inner, then it's time to divide. The centre of the plant will comprise dead foliage and roots. Dig out the plant in its entirety, remove all dead matter, then divide the clump into new plants. Replant and water well during the first season, giving the plant a good start with a handful of bone meal, or similar food, in the planting hole. Anne Hendry


HERITAGE OPEN DAYS


