Ed Vaizey Picks the Winners!

Despite some terrible weather about 30 people came to the Hall to meet our MP, Ed Vaizey, and to witness him draw the winning numbers from the Drayton2020 survey. Those numbers are 008, 182 and 881. If you have any of these tickets ring 531512 and £50 is yours. Mr Vaizey was very impressed by the questionnaire and by the high number of Drayton households that had completed it.

Oxfordshire Rural Community Council commented on the survey "The response in Drayton has far exceeded that of other communities that the ORCC has been working with. It shows a fantastic level of community engagement and a testament to the hard work and enthusiasm of all those involved".

We received further encouragement in an unsolicited email from the planning officers of the Vale of White Horse District Council: "It is great to see so much energy and commitment that embraces change and sees it as an opportunity to improve the village. This positive approach combined with the work you are doing with developers puts you in a strong position".

Drayton2020 is holding a special event in the Hall on Friday Oct 18th (bar and free chilli - see advert on page 9), with displays all day on Saturday Oct 19th to present the outcome of the survey.

This event brings us to the conclusion of the year-long consultative phase of the Neighbourhood Development Plan, and its outcome will form the basis for the Plan itself. We have more hurdles to cross but we are well on course to offer it for ratification by the village in a referendum to be held with national elections, probably next May. If it attracts more than 50 per cent of the vote the Plan becomes part of the framework for determining future planning decisions in Drayton.



Letter from St Peter's Church

Dear Friends.

When I was first asked to become a churchwarden I must admit I had no idea what was involved. At the time the church was going through what is known as an interregnum, this is just a posh word meaning that we were between vicars. During this period the day to day running of the church becomes the responsibility of the churchwardens and the parochial church council (PCC). Some of these things are quite small and straight forward others are much larger and more complicated.

The theft of part of the Reredos from the Lady Chapel has led to the church undertaking a complete detailed survey of the security of the church building, this has led us to conclusion that the best way to protect the Church and its contents is by the installation of a CCTV system. Easy you might think! But oh no the procedure that we have to go through to get permission to install this in a grade 2star listed church starts with a 40+ page form which has to be filled in and submitted along with detailed plans, and supporting documents from several other agencies including English Heritage, the historic Churches Trust and the District Council. The whole process has taken almost a year to complete. However we hope that we are now in the final stages of this which will mean that soon the church will once again be able to be open for the public to access during the daytime.

Now with Rebecca being on maternity leave we are almost back in the same position as when I became a churchwarden, however thanks to the hard work of all of the team we are managing to keep things ticking over. We are always ready to welcome anyone who wants to come to church be it regularly, or for special services. When all is said and done it is YOUR church! We are also always keen to hear your thoughts on what could be done to make it more user friendly. There is already a plan to reposition some of the pews to create an open space at the back of the church, we hope to be able to do this work ourselves to keep the cost to a manageable level. To enable us to complete this, we will need the advice and hopefully the assistance of any kind-hearted builders, carpenters and electricians that might be reading this and feel that they would like to help with a community project, a sort of DIY SOS but without the theatrical interference of Nick Knowles and his team of celebrity builders.

There has been a Church in Drayton for hundreds of years, but like all old institutions there comes a time when things have to change to keep pace with the needs of the modern world. To some these changes are a frightening prospect, but with care we can bring our church into the 21st century and be able to respect those who want to continue with the traditional way that the church operates, as well as opening our minds and attitudes to those who want something more upbeat and vibrant. In essence it's your church and you can influence the way it operates and what it offers to everyone who calls Drayton their home.



WESTMINSTER VIEW

Ed Vaizey's column (Wantage & Didcot MP, also he's Minister of Culture, Communications and Creative Industries)

When the Govt introduced Police & Crime Commissioners, one clear aim was to increase public accountability. While we have a low crime rate in the constituency compared with many other parts of the UK, I know that local residents do have concerns about many police issues, so the opportunity to make sure that those in charge of the police is very important indeed.

I am very pleased, therefore, to be able to publicise an event on Oct 14th. Anthony Stansfield, the Police and Crime Commissioner for Thames Valley, will be holding a **public meeting in Didcot**, **open to any to attend** (Didcot Civic Hall, 7pm).

It's an opportunity for him and the local police commander, (Supt Andy Boyd), to meet residents and deliver presentations about the role of the PCC and local policing in South Oxfordshire. Residents will be able to ask questions and feed back any concerns you may have about policing and crime. Please do go along if you can, both to hear about what is happening with policing locally and to put your own views to Mr Stansfield and his colleagues (Ed:- if you DO go, remember to ask about his expenses 'issue'!).

If the subject of crime is one that gets your blood pressure up, you might like to hear about some stats I recently saw. High blood pressure is one of the leading causes of a variety of illnesses, and it does not have any obvious symptoms but 1 in 3 UK people suffer from it. It's easily picked up with a quick check, which most GP surgeries will carry out on an ad-hoc basis. Why not get your blood pressure checked next time you see your GP, or make an appointment to do so if you may not be at the surgery for a while? It takes very, very little time but might save your life ...

Since Parliament has returned from the summer recess I've been getting your emails and letters thick and fast, on Syria, bovine TB and the Transparency of Lobbying, Non-Party Campaigning and Trade Union Administration Bill.

Kieth Smith aged 67, youngest son of Pansy Smith, died July 28th in Torbay Hospice, after a 6 year fight with cancer.

He was born and grew up in Drayton (many will know him from the church choir), moved to Babbacombe in 1986, served as a golf coach at the Palace Hotel (Torquay), until having an accident.

He was then a long-serving kit man to Brixham Rugby Club, where he was very highly thought of. He was also a brilliant artist and had two exhibitions, raising money for MacMillan nurses and Torbay hospital. Let's Build a Great Network

Dear Sir,

7 Greenacres

In Nov 2011 I was quite ill, which over the next 3 months turned out to be chronic bladder retention, kidneys failing, arrhythmia, and a probable enlarged prostate with a PSA of 223 (0.1 is ok!).

I was admitted to the Churchill in April 2012 and after being catheterised, which gave me an immediate improvement, I had a bone scan. I had to find out why but was eventually told that with a PSA of 223 I would probably have prostate cancer, hence the need for the scan. On leaving hospital a few days later, still with catheter for bladder draining, I had a prostate biopsy which confirmed advanced prostate cancer that had spread to my bones. However I was feeling rather well at the time.

Anyway I started immediately on hormone therapy by way of a single tablet daily and an implant that would last for 3 months at a time. Progress on this was excellent; my PSA was down to 4.5!

In June 2012 I had an operation called a TURP, which I won't explain now but it cured the bladder retention and other problems.

By November I had the heart problem corrected with something called a Cardioversion (electric shock under general anesthetic).

All in all I was doing rather well, doing everything I did before, a little muscle ache here and there but put that down to age (66).

Last month my PSA had risen again to about 31 but this is not unusual. I had a choice of Chemotherapy or a new treatment with a drug called Abiraterone. I decided on the Abiraterone, which seems good so far. No side effects to speak of. Daily tablets. Back to doing really well.



<u>County Council Report</u> With a team many times larger than the District Council, and a budget of nearly £1billion, it is understandable that decisions and actions take much longer to reach at County than at District. There is some good news for Drayton over pavement maintenance and weed clearance in the coming months, but we all (me included) will need to be patient.

There is a small pot of money <u>available for community schemes</u>. I've already had some interest, but would welcome more, so that I can co-ordinate applications. **Any community activity needing support or start-up help to the tune of £100 - £500** may be eligible. <u>Please let me know</u> if you are interested (by end-Oct).

Home to School Transport

It seems that this issue is not going to go away. OCC spends some £17m every year on School Transport. It needs to save over £100m across its budget and most areas are protected. I suspect that we will end up with schools themselves taking responsibility for the funding of school transport – starting with Academies. There is a gradual move towards making schools responsible for their own budgets and taking away the responsibilities of County Councils for Education provision. The changeover period will be painful and contentious, but OCC, in common with all County Councils has got some tough decisions to make in the next year or two. Drayton has been heavily involved in the debate over the past eighteen months and I am keen that we should stay involved.

Spare a thought

The County Division of 'Sutton Courtenay & Marcham' – in the middle of which sits Drayton (you may well ask how Drayton got left out of the name!) seems a very large and disconnected area with each village having its own, quite separate problems. Some of the problems are similar simply because all 3 of the larger villages are of similar size. There are many other shared problems, however, and all the villages including Appleford, Milton and Shippon have an interest in sharing their experiences and their ideas. Abingdon's problems are our problems, too. Increasingly, Didcot's problems are becoming ours. All are under threat of speculative planning applications. Sutton Courtenay is under special pressure from the expansion of Milton Park, a potential 1m square foot warehouse, the steadily increasing activity at the FCC waste recycling site, not to mention the demolition of Didcot A.

All these have implications for housing and transport in all the villages. It must be in all our interests for the villages and their Parish Councils to get together to share experiences, problems and solutions. I wonder if we all live too much in our own bubbles at present. We would surely have much more clout together.

Robins Class . . . This term the Robins have been focusing on getting to know each other and settling into their new class and school. Their class topic this term is 'All about me!' and they have been learning all about their friends & families, learning about their bodies and how they have changed since they were babies, also thinking about different feelings and celebrating their class bear Barnaby's birthday.


Puffins Class . . . The class topic this term is 'The land of make believe'. They have transformed themselves into Puffins, they all made a puffin body collage and photographs of their heads were attached, and a beak added! They have also been reading The Gruffalo and have been busy transforming their role play house into a forest. They have explored the wild area in our school grounds and recorded what they found onto their own maps. They have been sharing the Roald Dahl book, George's Marvellous Medicine, and have had a go at making their own potions.

Blackbirds Class . . . The year two topic is Fantastic Mr Fox. The children have enjoyed getting to know what the three farmers in the story are like, and have worked out adjectives for each of them. In Literacy, the children have also started work on connectives, so that they can learn how to extend sentences. The art work on the three farmers and Mr Fox is wonderful and is up in the classroom. For the next couple of weeks the children will be learning how to mix colours using powder paint. As always, you are welcome to come and see what is going on in the classroom.

Red Kites Class . . . are exploring the world of myths and legends. Already they have made a class story book which is available to read in their book corner! They have started looking at the Legend of King Arthur and how he became king. In the second week back they found a large stone/boulder in the middle of their carpet with a sword which had been forced into the top. Many children tried to pull the sword from the stone - but none succeeded. Until a young man named Hamish was asked to try. With ease, Hamish pulled the sword from the stone and was named the king of the classroom! They also found out what the inscription said on the sword - 'He who pulleth out this sword shall be named King of all England.'

Kingfishers Class . . . is a large class of 32 children who are in years 4 and 5. They have two fantastic teaching assistants: Mrs Lester and Mrs Nicholls and they are looking forward to a very exciting year. To start their autumn topic, Kingfishers have made a wonderful range of three-dimensional fish, which can be seen in class and around school. They are now raising money to buy pet fish for the classroom. Running alongside their entrepreneurial exploits, the children are learning all about the life cycles of fish and other animals, creating new explanation texts about how and why they need to care for their fish! They are also enjoying the challenges of Mathletics; an interactive maths programme which encourages and improves number bonds, multiplication skills, plus many other necessary life skills.

Eagles . . . have been Marooned! Using the character of Michael from Kensuke's Kingdom as their starting point, they debated whether or not to sail around the world, worked out that they could afford it if they 'only' went for a year, but despite detailed planning, things have gone wrong. How will they survive or keep warm? What will they eat? As the weather becomes more autumnal, they'll be designing shelters by investigating different aspects of structures, working out where they are in the world and how they might be rescued. They will be keeping diaries, writing letters for bottles, retelling their stories to journalists and producing a radio programme about their experiences. In addition they'll be learning about the exciting but sometimes gruesome history of global exploration, other characters (real or fictionalised) who have travelled, been marooned and survived (or not), and use some of their scientific investigation skills to act as ship's botanist and make their new homes work for them.

PARISH COUNCIL (Richard Williams)

One member of the public was present, David Mercer. As David was the author of the scoping report for Drayton 2020 (available on the village website) and is also the co-ordinator of the team currently working on the draft Neighbourhood Development Plan, he was interested in the £18.2 billion 'London Oxford' (or 'LOX') airport which has been proposed on the same site where a reservoir and 'garden city' have previously been suggested. As part of the airport site would actually be within Drayton Parish, it is a moot point whether consideration of the proposal should at least receive a mention in the NDP. It is understood that the Airports Commission has been tasked by the Government to come up with some initial recommendations on UK airport capacity by the end of this year, and to that end it is seeking responses from any interested parties by Sept 27th. The Parish Council will be making a formal written submission to the Commission by that date, which, naturally, will vigorously oppose the airport project.

As this issue has evidently caused concern among some Drayton residents, as well it might since we would be directly under the flight path of 4 runways (!), it is worth pointing out that the airport proposal is not new, but is actually the revival of a scheme first brought forward ten years ago. A Government White Paper published in 2003, 'The Future of Air Transport' gave only a single paragraph to the LOX proposal, noting that it relied on the presumption of radical and hugely expensive improvements being made to the site's road and rail connections. It commented that there were 'significant doubts about the feasibility and capacity of the promoters' proposals in this regard'.

Due to the sensitivity of any proposals to expand airport capacity in a densely populated country like the UK, we find ourselves in 2013 not much further forward than in 2003. Government and business seem united in their belief that future economic growth depends on us expanding our airport capacity, which can only be achieved by building new runways. However, the debate is as divided as ever about where that expansion should take place, but research for the PC's response to the Commission shows that LOX has so far not even featured on the list of possible sites. Moreover, and bearing in mind the state of the UK economy in recent years, it's apparent that development of new airports on 'greenfield' sites (eg the so-called 'Boris Island' in the Thames estuary) would be vastly more expensive and therefore risky than expanding existing sites like Heathrow or Gatwick. This is not to say that LOX could never happen, but it's not a favoured option by anyone currently speaking for the aviation industry or the government. $\rightarrow >>$

In addition, all PC minutes are now archived on the village website: www.drayton-near-abingdon.org – it also carries back copies of the Drayton Chronicle, information on Drayton 2020, and details of other events in the village.

The next Parish Council meeting will be on Monday Oct 7th, at 7.30pm, in the Caudwell Day Centre in Gravel Lane. As ever, all are **welcome to attend**.

Drayton 2020 - latest update

Further to last month's comments on the Questionnaire, ORCC (Oxfordshire Rural Community Council), who are analysing the results for us, report that over 600 forms were returned, with responses from more than 1000 individuals. This is an excellent response rate, so much better than the norm that it took ORCC by surprise and required them to take more time over the analysis than expected. Preliminary soundings indicate a high level of support for the idea of a new village centre on the Manor farm development, and a new sports field.

Meetings have been held with the County Council with regard to transport and education issues, to ascertain how OCC would respond to proposals on these matters made in the Neighbourhood Development Plan. As the District Council is the planning authority, Drayton 2020 is working with both the Vale and OCC to produce an integrated road safety strategy which would address the demands made by the planned housing developments. An outline framework has been drawn up for the draft NDP and work on this will be proceeding throughout the rest of September and October. The completed Draft will be published in November.

In the meantime, the Steering Group continues to meet fortnightly, and the next meeting after publication of this Chronicle will be on **Fri 4**th **October** at the Caudwell Centre in Gravel Lane at 7pm. All Steering Group meetings are open to any Drayton resident, and it would be great to see you there.

Please note that a Steering Group meeting will **not** be held on Fri 18th October, because this date has been earmarked for our next public consultation meeting, in the Village Hall that evening, see ad on page 9. GARD UPDATE

Thames Water (TW) staff are currently gestating the comments on their draft plan for 2015 to 2040 and the company will respond next month. It seems there were many submissions!

Meanwhile there are already solar farms on the reservoir site, which are sensible and environmentally friendly, with more planned and those have a 25 year contractual generating life but preserve the land for the landowners. Good luck to them.

Inevitably our area will attract other proposals but GARD's mission is to block a massive reservoir over the whole site to serve London. At present all the indications are that Thames Water is short of funds, is under scrutiny by Ofwat for trying to raise its charges to pay for its debt repayments, and to fund the proposed Thames Tideway Tunnel costing upwards of £4 billion to prevent sewage flowing into the Thames during heavy rain. All TW customers would have to pay for this. Our interest, however is in water supply for London. All GARD's evidence shows that transfer of water from the Severn and Wales to top up existing reservoirs, when needed, via pipeline (or canal) provides a cheaper, more flexible, quicker, more sustainable and far less damaging solution. Understandably there are a lot of engineering studies to be undertaken to refine the work and routes, but the water quality and ecological studies are presently proving favourable but incomplete, GARD is prodding hard at Thames Water who appear to be making haste very slowly!
