### **Parish Council Latest**

This report is of the meeting on January 9th, the December meeting's report is on page 12 (*Richard Williams*).

There have been a number of **compliance issues** regarding the Miller Homes site at Walnut Meadow (Barrow Rd). For example, poor drainage led to flooding of the access roads in recent heavy rains. It is hoped recent modification works have sorted out this particular problem. There are still ongoing difficulties, by no means confined to this site, as **similar problems seem to be occurring on housing sites across the Vale**.

The Department dealing with planning enforcement is clearly very stretched, but they have made efforts to get a grip on the situation. They have now begun a series of pre-commencement visits to sites in an attempt to identify and deal with possible issues in advance.

Several such visits have already been made to the south of High St site. With regard to Walnut Meadow, Drayton 2020 are doing their best to maintain regular contact with Millers' management with a view to monitoring progress.

Richard Webber, our County Councillor, confirms that the proposal for unitary local government in Oxfordshire is now **online for public consultation**. The full document can be seen at www.oneoxfordshire.org (Richard's column: - see page 10).

The service commemorating the awarding of the VC (in 1917) to **Sgt Edward John Mott** took place at St Peter's Church on Sun Jan 22nd. A **full report** should appear in next month's issue, but suffice it to say that the service was a fitting memorial to a very brave man, and the church was packed with people, including many members of the Mott family. There were 188 people present in all, 169 adults and 19 children, a most impressive congregation!

#### **AMAZON FRAUDS!**

We get many alerts these days about attempted online fraud, but this one is very plausible, and relates to the extremely popular Amazon. Action Fraud has received several reports from victims who have been sent convincing looking emails claiming to be from Amazon. The spoofed emails from "service@amazon.co.uk" claim recipients have made an order online and mimic an automatic customer email notification.

The scam email claims recipients have ordered an expensive item, and cleverly state that if recipients haven't authorised the transaction they can click on the help centre link to receive a full refund. The link leads to an authentic-looking website, which asks victims to confirm their name, address, and bank card information.

Amazon will <u>never ask</u> for personal information to be supplied by e-mail, so, as ever, DO BE CAREFUL.

The NHS in Oxfordshire has launched phase 1 of the 'Big Health and Care Consultation', your chance to share your views on proposals to change some Oxon healthcare services.

We really want to have a conversation with you, local dates: Oxford Feb 9th, 7pm to 9pm; Didcot Feb 13th, 10am to noon; Wantage Feb 7th, 3pm to 5pm; Abingdon March 23rd, 6.30 to 8.30pm. (Ed:- they didn't have the wit to include the precise locations, you get those when you book I presume).

And on Jan 19th OCC published their 'A Fresh Start for Oxfordshire'; draft proposals for one new Oxon unitary council.

This can be seen at <a href="www.oneoxfordshire.org">www.oneoxfordshire.org</a> — it suggests abolishing all six councils (county and district), & to replace them with a single new unitary council for the whole of Oxfordshire. The significant savings made by eliminating duplication from running six councils could be used to improve public services and protect them from future cuts. Joining up the key strategic functions of planning, transport and housing will help us ensure housing and infrastructure are delivered in a sustainable way.

Such a new council would hopefully be:- Simpler for residents and business; Better for services; More local; and accomplish much better value by much Lower costs (eliminating duplication and waste). They WANT YOUR VIEWS, before submitting a final bid to central government for a decision. 





### WESTMINSTER VIEW

Ed Vaizey's column (Wantage & Didcot MP; presently on the Commons Speaker's Advisory Panel on the Arts)

Welcome to 2017! As this is my first Parish News of the New Year, may I wish you Happy New Year and hope that you had a wonderful Christmas and got to spend time with your families and loved ones.

2017 has arrived with quite a full in-tray for me as your local MP. Issues such as the **congestion on the A34**, the continued campaign to **re-open Grove station**, my campaign to secure **better fertility treatment** for people in Oxfordshire, and the need to secure **continued investment in science and technology** post-Brexit will take centre stage.

One of the issues I am most contacted about is **local health services**, and I share many of the concerns my constituents have raised about the ongoing review, known as the Sustainability and Transformation Plan. I am very unhappy with how the process is being undertaken, and the constant delays to publishing anything meaningful is having a severe impact on local services. Prior to Christmas two GP practices failed in a bid to secure funding to expand their premises to cater from growing populations.

This situation is becoming very urgent, and I shall be meeting local NHS chiefs early in the New Year to try and get from them a clear timeline for the STP, so that we can all have a say in how our health services are developed. I am also seeking meetings with health ministers to discuss the failed capital bids for GP surgeries, so I can understand why they were turned down and to have greater success in the future.

In January I will be also co-hosting a debate in Parliament on the **provision of IVF treatment**. This is an area that I have campaigned on for some time, and I am frequently contacted by constituents who are having difficulty funding fertility treatment. I fear that this area is seen as a treatment that local health services can easily cut and reduce. I will be making Ministers aware of my concerns, and hope they take some action to further protect this important service.

### Drayton 2020 - Update

#### **Drayton2020 Neighbourhood Plan Update**

Sports Pitches and Pavilion The architect's plans for the new Sports Pavilion are now being finalised and an application for planning permission for the Pavilion, car park and multi-use sports area (MUGA) will be submitted to VWHDC by Drayton Parish Council in late January/early February. The MUGA will have provision for tennis, netball, basketball, 5 a side football and ball target sports, and will be floodlit to provide for winter ball practice. Details of the plans will be published in the March Chronicle. Approval has already been secured for three football pitches (one adult size and two junior) and a cricket square. A children's playground will be provided by the developers and managed by the Parish Council.

**Footpaths** Volunteers continue to work on clearing and widening the footpaths on and around the Millennium Green. Quotes are being sought from contractors to top dress the surfaces and repair damage sustained over the last 15-20 years

**Barrow Road/Walnut Meadow** – About 15 houses are now occupied on the site and mains sewerage is now connected

**South of High Street Site** Planning permission for 140 houses has been granted by VWHDC. Work on site is expected to begin soon

**Manor Farm** CALA Homes have revised their planning application. The VWHDC are expected to make their decision on this revised application during February

**Halls Close** The developers – Blue Cedar – are working up their detailed planning application. They now have outline planning permission for up to 28 houses on the site, with road access via Halls Close

**East Way** VWHDC have approved a planning application for 8 more houses with access via East Way. The developers will need to submit detailed plans on how they propose to improve the East Way road access. They have undertaken to re-surface the roadway and maintain it for 10 years thereafter.

<u>The next Parish Council meeting</u> will be on Mon Feb 6th, at 7.30 pm, in the Caudwell Day Centre in Gravel Lane. As ever, all are welcome to attend.



### Halls Close 'Planning' Appeal Decision

In the Christmas edition of the Chronicle, our District Councillor, Stuart Davenport, told us that the Halls Close Appeal decision was "a clear assault on our recently adopted Neighbourhood Plan" and "seemed to represent an inspector acting out of line with other decisions for similar schemes."

What a shame, therefore, that Councillor Davenport didn't turn up to speak at the Appeal Hearing even though it lasted all day. What a shame he didn't even send a substitute or a statement to be read out. Mind you, the current Chair of the Planning Committee, Councillor Lovatt, seems to think the Halls Close Inspector made the right decision. He emailed me recently to say:-

The Officers recommended approval, the Chairman of the Planning Committee, Robert Sharp, and the Planning Portfolio Holder, Roger Cox, voted for it. The Vice Chairman, me, was not present. It was the other members of the committee that voted against the application. The Planning Inspector essentially upheld the advice of the planning officers.

In fact Councillors Sharp and Cox abstained so not one member of the Planning Committee supported the Planning Officers' recommendation, but Councillor Lovatt had more to say about Drayton and Neighbourhood Planning:

There was another application for the land at Close End House, another infill site, which, under my chairmanship, the committee approved on 30th November. This brought out the argument by the Parish Council that the land in question had not been taken into consideration in the formulation of the Neighbourhood Plan (NP), was therefore not in the NP and therefore the application should be refused. If not, what is the purpose of having an NP?

I therefore asked officers the question, "If an area of development is not included in a neighbourhood plan, is that material grounds for refusal?". I was told "No".

The purpose of a neighbourhood plan is specifically not to prevent or restrict development but to enable it. The incentive for this is that an NP entitles the Parish to a larger share (25%) of the Community Infrastructure Levy (CIL) to facilitate desired development.

This begs the question - If an area of development is not in an NP and can still get planning permission what is the incentive for a developer to have anything to do with Neighbourhood

I used to think Dibley Parish Council was the most hopeless council in the country. What a shame Drayton cannot Drexit from the Vale.



#### **Unitary Govt – Time for Oxon residents to decide**

It was confirmed by both sets of the expensively-commissioned experts that Oxfordshire's Local Government is badly in need of improvement and that Unitary Governmet in some form is the obvious way forward. The estimated savings from forming a single Unitary Council (replacing the present County and 5 District Councils) amount to more than £20m every year.

When the issue is explained to residents, almost all I have spoken to respond "Surely, it's a no-brainer. So why are we not getting on with it?"

There seem to be two types of argument that are raised against a single oxfordshire Unitary solution. The first type all boil down to Councils and councillors desperately arguing for self preservation. The second group of objections is more worthy of an answer.

With large councils comes a reduction in democratic accountability. But how many of us know our District or County Councillor? How many of us even know what the different councils do? I certainly didn't before I got directly involved. At present there are 63 County Councillors. The experts reckon there would be 120 Unitary Councillors in one Oxfordshire Unitary Council. In other words, each councillor would be responsible for half the number of people. Councils would no longer be able to pass the buck between each other. There would be *one council* responsible for all local services, *one council* to make the big necessary decisions and *one council* to blame if things go wrong. In my view, that would give local government *more* not less democratic accountability.

Every day we delay in going Unitary wastes public money – that is the money that you and I pay in our Council Tax. £20 million of savings every year is approximately £60,000 per day – the equivalent of filling many potholes, supporting a Children's Centre, or retaining several bus services. Can we really afford to delay further? As someone who has spent the past four years facing the dreadful choices that austerity has offered, I must ask is the prevarication any longer morally justifiable?

However you feel on this issue, I very much hope that all residents of Appleford, Milton, Sutton Courtenay, Drayton, Marcham and Shippon will join me on entering their views on the OCC website where a consultation is about to begin. It is about time that ratepayers rather than councils or councilors should be allowed their say.

### Parish Council Richard Williams

<u>Meeting report – Dec 5th</u> (Jan meeting : see front page)

Despite being opposed by the Parish Council and our ward District Councillor (Stuart Davenport), the 'Close End House' development - 8 new houses accessed from Eastway - was approved by the Vale's Planning Committee on 30<sup>th</sup> November. This was not a surprise, as the decision followed the officers' recommendation, but it was worrying as it is now the second time in 18 months that a site not included in the Neighbourhood Plan has been granted planning permission.

In the course of the evening it became clear that we have a number of issues with the Vale that badly need resolution, and therefore a meeting with the Vale's Development Managers has been arranged for early February. Hopefully this will clarify matters and enable us to move on.

The good news is that the Vale's own Local Plan Part 1 has now been confirmed as 'sound', and the district now has a 5 year land supply. Unfortunately, the announcement comes too late to help us with the Halls Close and Eastway applications. As it turns out, local residents were willing to take both of these planning decisions to the High Court to seek judicial review. Sensibly, they first approached independent professionals for legal advice. Sadly, they were informed that there was no realistic chance of success in either case, so there was little point in proceeding further.

However, the Parish Council is meeting on Jan 23rd with Blue Cedar, the developers of the Halls Close site, to discuss matters of site layout, building materials, landscaping etc, in an effort to minimise the impact on existing residents. Meanwhile, the PC's major objection to the Eastway site was, and still is, the access arrangements, which involve an unmade, unadopted roadway and a bridleway. It looks as though legal complications will result from this, and it remains to be seen how they will be resolved.

# Neighbourhood Action Group (NAG5 Safety Corner)

Please take a few minutes to read these reminders about the best ways in which to **keep yourself and others safe** when out and about.

#### **Pedestrians**

Use pavements, or paths, whenever possible.

If there is no pavement keep to the right-hand side of the road so that you can see oncoming traffic, keep close to the side of the road and walk in single file

In poor daylight conditions help road users to see you by wearing or carrying something light-coloured, bright or fluorescent.

When it's dark use reflective materials (armbands, jackets, waistcoats, sashes, footwear). Drivers using headlights can see reflective materials three times further away than those that are non-reflective.

Never try to cross the road in front or behind of a vehicle with its engine running.

#### **Cyclists**

At night white front and red rear lights must be lit. Flashing lights are permitted but it is recommended that cyclists who are riding in areas without street lighting use a steady front lamp. Bicycles must be fitted with a red rear reflector. Lights and reflectors should be kept clean and in good working order.

Brakes must work efficiently, gears should be working correctly and the chain properly adjusted and oiled.

Tyres should be in good condition and inflated to the pressure indicated on the tyre.

All traffic signs and traffic light signals must be obeyed. You must not cross the stop line when the traffic lights are red. Some junctions have an advanced stop line to enable you to wait and position yourself ahead of the traffic.

You must not cycle on a pavement (if you are concerned for your safety, or that of young children, you can dismount and push your bicycle on the pavement until you feel it is safe to re-join the road).

For your own safety please wear a helmet and light coloured or fluorescent clothing in daylight and reflective clothing at night to help to ensure that other road users see you.

(Ed's note:- sorry, cynical hat on here, this looks all well and good, but somehow I doubt that the considerable numbers of riders that I've encountered, over many years, riding the wrong way in Abingdon's East & West St Helens, for example, will be taking much notice! Mind you, this piece does NOT actually say that such a thing is explicitly forbidden, the 'traffic signs' reference, well, if they don't see them, they don't apply?!)

#### Vehicle drivers

Keep your windscreen and other windows clear of dirt and remove any snow from front and rear lights, windscreen, windows and roof using de-icer and a scraper as necessary.

Ensure the windscreen wipers are in working order and keep the screen wash reservoir topped up.

Ensure front and rear lights are in full working order and free from dirt. Use headlights in seriously reduced visibility.

Tyres should have a minimum 2mm of tread and preferably 3mm or above -- Remember that stopping distances are **10 times longer** in ice and snow.

Avoid the water pump freezing by using antifreeze (had it checked lately?).

Carry an emergency kit in the car: tow rope, shovel, hazard-warning triangle, a fully charged mobile phone, de-icing equipment, a working torch, warm clothing, wellington boots, blanket and emergency rations including a hot drink in a flask.
