With due apologies to those readers who echo the sentiments of the Bristol woman, shown on several TV news bulletins mouthing something like "WHAT – not another b***** one", or a few people who've been away getting blotto for a couple of weeks and hadn't seen any news, I feel obliged to mention the election topic.

No, NOT the one in June, DO try and ignore that one for a bit (ha-ha), I'm referring to the Oxfordshire County Council vote on Thursday May 4th, when according to the OCC website, all 63 Councillors will be up for election. Drayton now comes under the Division labelled 'Sutton Courtenay & Marcham' (Marcham indeed – hasn't even got its own village hall . . .) and, again according to that website, we'll have 4 names on the voting slips, Stuart Davenport (Conservative), Coral Plumb (Labour), Craig Simmons (Green) and Richard Webber (Liberal Democrat). That's not in any order of bias, it's alphabet order of surname. And no Monster Raving Loony, no UKIP, no Flat Earth Society, just that pretty sober bunch listed. And not even a "Let's be like Sweden and try a 6 hour working day" candidate. Tsh-tsh. Oh, nearly forgot, just one councillor to be elected.

Whoever you like, do try and vote, the county has a lot to work on imminently, especially if the new unitary authority comes to fruition as expected. Perhaps it should be noted what the County provides (or occasionally not these days, as the case may be):-Children's services; Support for schools; Fire and Rescue; Libraries and museums; Roads; Social care for older people and disabled adults; Community transport; Trading standards; Countryside services, & Waste disposal

Now, that other one, (the one we'll be bombarded with info, interviews, opinions, polls and theories about for several more joyous weeks), Ed Vaizey (our MP) included in his monthly bulletin (p6) this extra info, on this topic:-

Our Prime Minister, Theresa May, has announced that the public would be returning to the polls in a snap General Election to take place on June 8th. I appreciate that we have gone to the polling station many times in the past year – the EU referendum, local council elections and now the upcoming General Election. However, I share the view of my colleagues that this is the right move at the right time to secure the strong and stable leadership the UK requires.

For those of you who haven't already, in order to have your say and mark your ballot on June 8th, you **must register to vote** by May 22nd. It only takes a few minutes and can be done online at gov.uk/register-to-vote. If you are unable to vote in person on the date, you can arrange a postal vote or a proxy — when you nominate somebody to vote on your behalf. Anyone who is registered to vote can apply for either of these voting methods and instructions can be found at: www.yourvotematters.co.uk.

NB If you're registered to vote in Oxfordshire County Council elections, you won't need to register again for the General Election.

Letter from St Peter's

Dear Friends,

Recently I was asked which was more important, Christmas or Easter? The answer could be a chicken and egg problem.

However important the event of Jesus' birth was, it is his death and resurrection that's more important to all those who believe in Christ. How do you know when it is Christmas? When Easter eggs are in the supermarkets - Hot Cross buns seem to be available all year round!

Christmas and Easter are not the only events in the Christian year. There are festivals and fund raising occasions and times for rejoicing and remembering. In the weeks after Easter the Church celebrates the coming together of Jesus' disciples, or followers, and their forming of the Church, a birthday if you like, Pentecost.

WESTMINSTER VIEW

Ed Vaizey's column (Wantage & Didcot MP; presently on the Commons Speaker's Advisory Panel on the Arts)

Thank you to all those who contacted me after the terrorism incident in Westminster. My team and I are fine and offer our sincerest condolences to each of the victims and their families. PC Keith Palmer lost his life protecting MPs and their staff, and his bravery and professionalism will never be forgotten.

The Government have now invoked Article 50 and formally commenced the UK's process of withdrawing from the European Union. Over the next two years, the Government will now be tasked with negotiating a positive new partnership with the EU's remaining member states. The Prime Minister has made clear that she will attempt to deliver an outcome that works in the interests of the whole of the UK and will not ignore those who voted to 'Remain'. MPs will be able to debate, scrutinise and vote on important negotiating decisions and I will make sure that the voices of the constituency are heard throughout.

Some of you may be aware of the 1940s film 'Magic Town' in which the owner of a company which performs consumer surveys lacks the funds to compete with its larger rivals in the field. Instead, he comes across a small town which he believes is perfectly representative of the nation's views and uses it to conduct his research. This month, the team at ASI Data Science used modern data science methods to establish a new 'Magic Town' - an area that is most representative of the whole country. Their verdict? Our very own Didcot! Of course, we have always known that Didcot is indeed a 'Magic Town', but it is great to see it finally get the official recognition it deserves!

I am pleased to see that the Oxfordshire Cycling Network has launched its vision of a future Strategic Cycle Network for Oxfordshire. This will be a county-wide 'all ages, all abilities' cycle network linking major towns, workplaces and transport hubs with safe, direct and attractive routes. The 366-mile network could cost £120m and take 15 to 20 years to build, but it would bring transport and health benefits of worth at least 7 times that in the 20 year period alone.



Parish Council Richard Williams

Report of the Annual Parish Assembly and Parish Council meeting held on Mon 3rd April.

<u>Annual Parish Assembly</u>: The Chairman and sub-committee chairs reported on events of the previous year. Amongst the items recorded, it was noted that the Parish Council:

- considered 60 planning applications, which represents a 50% increase in numbers on last year. One of these was the major development at Manor Farm;
- gave grants totalling £17,511 to seven Drayton and four other local organizations,
 - officially opened the refurbished Lockway playground in June;
- organized the church service to commemorate the 100th anniversary of the WW1 action in which Edward John Mott (born in Drayton) won the Victoria Cross (the memorial paving stone is now in place beneath the lych gate entrance to St Peter's Church);
- liaised with the RAF's 'Memorial Mob' over the church service to mark the 60th anniversary of the Sutton Wick Air Crash;
- unveiled the Blue Plaque to Rev F.E. Robinson (bell-ringer) on May 22nd;
- maintained village footpaths, burial ground and allotments, cleared litter, and cut grass throughout summer months;
- supported the Millennium Green Trust in several weekend working groups, helping to widen the existing footpaths and assisting with general clearing-up tasks;
 - contributed to catering costs of the August Right Royal Picnic;
- commissioned architects' plans for the new sports pavilion and submitted planning application;
 - co-ordinated project for design and build of a new pre-school.

→ Other reports were given on various village activities by Tom Shebbeare (Drayton 2020 Implementation Committee); Roxy Elford and Holly Freeland (DAMASCUS Project); Keith Clough (Millennium Green Trust); Ann Webb & Tony Holmes (Village Hall); Andrew Bax (Drayton Community Trust); Daniel Scharf (Drayton Diners); Vicky Malin (Caudwell Day Centre); Camilla King (Drayton Almshouses); Tamsin Meredith (FODSA – Friends of Drayton School Association); Rachel Hammond (Stonehill Community Garden), and Tim Atkins (Allotments).

Richard Webber and Stuart Davenport, our OCC and Vale councillors respectively, gave an update on county and district matters. Both reports mainly concerned the proposed local government reorganization, whereby the present four district councils and county council would disappear, to be replaced by a single unitary council. The position of Oxford City Council in these negotiations is not yet clear. The problems of an inner-city council are not the same as those of the more rural district councils, and the political complexion of Oxford is also different, with the City being Labour controlled. It was pointed out that Labour councillors will not want to be subsumed into a body where they are the minority, but in any case, unitary council or not, some functions are likely to be devolved to a more local basis planning being but one example. No doubt Richard and Stuart will have more to say on this in their own columns, but major change in some form is now definitely in sight.

Parish Council
The usual PC meeting followed, but in fact, most of its agenda, including the above councillors' reports had already been dealt with in the extended Annual Parish Assembly. If anyone wishes to know more, please be aware that the full Council Report for 2016/17, including the Chairman's and subcommittee reports and parish accounts are all available on the village website: Parish Council tab, then 'Agendas and minutes' on the drop-down menu.

The next PC meeting will be the AGM, at which office-holders must be re-elected. <u>Please note</u> this meeting will be held on Monday May 8th, (7.30 pm), in the Caudwell Day Centre in Gravel Lane, a week later than usual due to Mon May 1st being the May Bank Holiday. <u>As ever, all are welcome to attend</u>.

PCC launches new Police and Crime Plan

The Police and Crime Commissioner (PCC), Anthony Stansfeld, has launched his new five year Police and Crime Plan for the Thames Valley. The document sets out the priorities for policing and other crime reduction organisations. It consists of five strategic priorities which are:-

Vulnerability – Managing demand on services through working together with a particular focus on mental health, elder abuse, hidden abuse, and the criminal justice experience for victims.

Prevention and Early Intervention – Improving safeguarding in both the physical and virtual space including tackling cyber crime, road safety, peer on peer abuse, hate crime and female genital mutilation (FGM).

Reducing Re-offending – Targeting and managing harm and risk with a focus on substance misuse, violence involving weapons and offender management.

Serious Organised Crime and Terrorism – Improving the local response including increased public awareness, promoting a 'dare to share' culture, and preventing violent extremism and exploitation of vulnerable people.

Police Ethics and Reform – Increasing the pace of change with a focus on improved support for victims, uptake of new technology, and improving the perceptions of police among young people

The Plan was informed by the views of nearly 5000 residents, including over 1000 young people, who took part in the PCCs policing and crime survey in 2016.

It was also developed using a broad range of information including academic research, analysis of crime trends and consultation with partners including the police and local authorities

Anthony Stansfeld said: "Demand on policing and community safety issues have changed over the last few years and my new plan reflects this. The Plan focuses on many new and emerging issues for policing but crimes such as household burglary and rural crime will also remain a priority.

"Tackling new demand, as well as maintaining support for the investigation of more traditional crimes, won't be an easy task. However, as recent Her Majesty's Inspectorate of Constabulary (HMIC) inspections have shown, Thames Valley Police is a force we can be proud of and I have faith that they will be able to rise to this challenge and continue to safeguard the communities of Thames Valley.

"I will now be working closely with partner organisations to understand how they will address the issues identified."



This was featured in the local news a couple of months ago, but for those who didn't see it, any travellers from Abingdon may be surprised to stumble upon a little piece of home hiding an hour's drive away from Perth (that's the Australian one, not Scottish!).

Nestled among scrubland near a chocolate factory is a quirky attraction that boasts replicas of Abingdon landmarks, including tiny versions of County Hall Museum and popular riverside pub the Old Anchor Inn.

Sutton Courtenay resident Jenny Shaw amazed Facebook users in January when she posted pictures of the Amaze Miniature Park, near the city of Mandurah. She said: "It's on a freeway next to a lorry depot, it's very weird. They've got a maze there and a little tea shop, it was a sleepy little place, but it's a nice recognition of Abingdon's history - if you're in the area, you have got to go."

Dianne Murphy, who ran the attraction with husband Peter from 2012-2015, said it was partly because of Abingdon's status as the oldest continually-inhabited town in England. The originators of Abingdon Miniature Village were both Australian and had never even visited Abingdon. However when they researched possible towns they came across Abingdon as a perfect choice, mainly for its links to the military and being the home of the MG factory both of great interest to the owner - as well as the history and historic buildings.
