MANOR FARM

Consultation on Layout and Use of New Green Space

Now that the VoWHDC are about to approve CALA's planning permission for 56 houses at Manor Farm, the Parish Council is undertaking a consultation on the Green area which will be <u>the new open space at the heart of the village</u>.

During July this will be publicised on internal noticeboards in the Village Hall, Caudwell Day Centre, and throughout the village; also on the village website and the Families in Drayton Facebook page, and will be emailed to the D2020 email list.

A copy will be published in the next Drayton Chronicle.

Kier Highways, on behalf of Highways England, will be resurfacing a section of the <u>A34 southbound carriageway</u> from Abingdon to Drayton, to ensure the carriageway remains in a safe and serviceable condition. It's a lower noise material, thinner than conventional Hot Rolled Asphalt and has qualities which reduces noise levels.

The resurfacing works are currently scheduled to take place on the following dates:- Thurs 6 July to Sat 8 July, (3 consecutive nights), & Monday 10 and Tuesday 11 July (two nights), all works will be carried out overnight between 9pm and 6am.

<u>We will need to fully close</u> the A34 southbound carriageway from the Hinksey Hill junction to the A4185 Milton Interchange. During these closures a clearly signed diversion will be in place from the Botley Interchange, along the A420, A338 to Wantage, then east along the A417 back to the A34.

GARD Report -- July

Thames Water to hold drop-in session on reservoir plans

As previously reported in the last newsletters, Thames Water's plan for New Water Source options for their 2019 Five-year Water Resources Management Plan includes, amongst others, a revival of their defeated 2010 plan for the massive 'Abingdon' reservoir to be sited on the land between Steventon, Hanney, Drayton and Marcham.

Following this realisation there has been considerable adverse comment in local papers, TV and radio, and well-received antireservoir GARD presentations at Steventon Parish Council public participation, at Hanney Parish Council's Annual Meeting and, most recently (12th June), at an open meeting in Hanney War Memorial Hall. Thames Water have realised that they have a problem convincing the local population of the need for a reservoir and to try to 'sell' their line that the reservoir would not be an imposition and a danger to our local area.

Consequently TW have announced that they will be holding a 'drop-in session' in <u>Steventon Village Hall on Monday 10th July</u> <u>from around 2pm to around 8pm</u> (exact times will be confirmed). Local residents from Steventon and the other villages are advised to see for themselves and air their concerns with Thames Water staff. At this time it is not known if this event will be repeated at any of the other villages.

We remind our readers that even Thames Water's own figures show that there is enough water from the sources other than the reservoir to satisfy the South-East water deficit out to at least 2080. This demonstrates that there is no need for the reservoir in the foreseeable future.

Also, we remind readers that Thames Water'e leakage record is the worst of all large Water Companies, and they lose one-quarter of all their water supplied via leakage. Only recently, they have been fined £8.5M by the water regulator, OFWAT, for missing their own leakage target – so they are not at all improving. This must change to enable them to supply water securely in the future, but it will only do so by public pressure. If Thames cut their leakage rate to that of Anglian Water, it would save an amount of water per year equal to the output of the proposed Abingdon Resrvoir! \rightarrow >>

GARD's next activities in opposing the reservoir plans

As Thames Water continues to develop the designs of their water source options, GARD will continue its opposition.

GARD members and our expert consultant will meet the Environment Agency in the next two months. Two meetings are planned where we will explain our alternative for supplying the water for Oxfordshire's relatively modest predicted water deficit up to 2040 and beyond, and will press our concerns that the Environment Agency are not being critical enough of Thames Water's overall plan.

GARD believes that 'indirect water re-use' schemes, returning treated water to the Thames above Farmoor and water transfers from the Severn to the Thames will supply enough for our local water zone. We also believe that London's predicted water shortages (more than 15 times larger than Oxfordshire's) can also be supplied by indirect re-use and Severn to Thames water transfer, and by an additional means, not available in Oxfordshire, that of desalination of Thames Estuary water.

GARD will also meet OFWAT at the end of July. **OFWAT are important** as they have to be convinced that Thames Water's plans represent best value for customers.

GARD have asked to see the data behind the costings which Thames Water claim for the various water supply options in their plan. We are not convinced that Thames have fully and fairly costed the reservoir against the competing options of water transfer, water re-use and desalination.

The reservoir is a whopping $\pounds 1.5$ Billion estimated cost by Thames, and we are concerned that they are skewing the costs of the other alternatives to try to make their overall costs appear comparable.

GARD have asked Thames Water to reveal their costs, but Thames are hiding behind commercial confidentiality and refuse to reveal even limited data. OFWAT have not viewed this very kindly, and we are hoping for more support from them to try and expose any flaws in Thames's costings.

Joining GARD

Our membership continues to increase, and we are recruiting members from the new housing developments. It appears that noone buying a house on the new developments in this area has been informed of the possibility of a 9-year duration, £1.5Billion construction project taking place (in the case of Steventon, East Hanney and the south part of Drayton) just over their garden fence!

Steventon Bridge

Dear Editor

Steventon Parish Council

More than 4 years ago now, Network Rail first presented their plan to demolish the road bridge in Steventon, Oxfordshire as part of the the electrification of the Great Western line. It subsequently emerged that, although Network Rail's own contractor Atkins had written a report stating that the track could be lowered to avoid demolition, **this option had not been explored**.

Historic England (ex English Heritage) therefore commissioned Belgian electrification experts TUC Rail to report on possible alternatives for Steventon bridge and a number of other bridges on the western mainline. The report proposed several measures which are common practice in European countries with more experience of electrification, and which would negate the need to demolish this historic bridge and close (<u>for a year</u>) a road which plays a key role in the strategic road network. Network Rail failed to respond to the points raised in this report, instead hiring TUC Rail to oversee some other challenging parts of the western mainline, clearly validating TUC's expertise but preventing them from supporting us further.

Another year passed, during which Network Rail failed to communicate at all, and indeed ignored repeated enquiries from all levels of local government. Historic England, as a key consultee to the planning process for listed buildings, remained of the view that, until Network Rail supplied overwhelming evidence to justify the need to demolish the bridge, they would reject any application. Network Rail came back to the table suddenly with a back-of-anenvelope proposal to close an adjacent level crossing, dividing our community in two, the need for which was also negated by the recommendations of the TUC report; thankfully under intense popular pressure this application was withdrawn.

Unfortunately, our MP Ed Vaizey, has appeared neither interested in discussing the details of the project, nor aware of the huge disruption that this needless demolition will cause to a vast number of his constituents. We have been grateful for the support of our district councillor (and leader of VoWHDC) Matt Barber, who has acknowledged that the B4017 "is an important part of the strategic road network", as well as being the principal diversion route when the A34 is closed (which is often!), and has assured us that the VoWHDC will support Historic England's view on the listed building consent.

The application was finally submitted by Network Rail in May, along with a flimsy and nebulous technical justification from their consultants. We intend to rebut this application in the strongest possible terms, and hold this opaque, publicly-funded yet privately-operated organisation to a suitably high standard of evidence before they are permitted to embark on this poorly thought-out plan to destroy a historic listed structure and cause turmoil in the daily lives of thousands. Despite the clear and dangerous precedent this would set, regrettably we expect Network Rail to apply political pressure to the planning process, rather than properly explore any alternative, cheaper, better solution.

County Council Report

With all the national political turmoil going on at present, it is difficult for any of us to focus on local issues. However, since I cannot think of anything that I could write which would make things better or worse nationally, I will confine myself to local issues only.

A34 Noise

Since 2005, when I first became involved in local politics, I have been asked many times what is the thing I want most for Drayton. My answer has always been the same. It is the resurfacing of the A34 with 'quiet' tarmac. Wherever you live in the village, the noise of A34 traffic has an impact. To the north of the village, the A34 lies in a gulley which greatly reduces the traffic volume. However, unless the wind is blowing due west (which is a rarity), there is not a single Drayton property which is unaffected by the A34 noise from the south. Here, the road is raised as it goes over Steventon Road. Villagers in southern Drayton have had to put up with the noise since the A34 was built in the seventies. As the traffic has increased over recent years, their lives have become increasingly blighted.

'Quiet' tarmac is expensive and National Highways have, until now, been unwilling to resurface the road. It has now been announced that the resurfacing will be completed in the next few months. There will be night time disruption and closure for a few months while the work is being done –but it will be well worth it.

The reduced noise from 'quiet' tarmac is the result of the extra compaction of the surface and the consequent reduction in friction between tyre and road. I suspect that tyres last longer as a result. It is likely that we would all get more miles to the gallon if all tarmac was 'quiet'.

The news is good for the environment, good for the economy and, above all, great news for Drayton. \rightarrow >>

Parish Council Richard Williams

Report of the Parish Council meeting held on Mon June 5th.

The meeting began with a presentation by Huw Thomas from Thames Water that lasted about 40 minutes, with questions. Huw explained that in Oxfordshire, and probably across most of the south-east, population growth is beginning to outstrip water supply. Obviously, the development of new housing is a main contributing factor, but there are others, the fact that we tend to use more water per household than we used to, and climate change. The weather seems in recent years to have become more variable and unpredictable – more extreme in many ways - but in global terms there seems little doubt that temperatures are gradually increasing and drought is becoming more common.

Huw spoke of the various options that were open to Thames Water to address the water supply issue, and it will come as no surprise to most readers that the proposed reservoir between Steventon and the Hanneys is still on the agenda. Several other solutions are also being considered, but councillors' questions naturally focused mainly on the reservoir. The issue of upgrading the sewerage system in Drayton to cope with all the new housing was also raised, and Huw promised to come back to the PC in September with more detail on how Thames Water plans to do this.

A piece of good news that should improve the lives of all of us in Drayton a little bit is that the A34 between Hinksey Hill and the Milton Interchange is to be re-surfaced with the new quieter tarmac. This does significantly reduce the amount of road noise generated, as anyone who has driven on it will have noticed. \rightarrow

→ On 12th June, the Planning Committee of the PC met to discuss the Blue Cedar application to build 21 houses at the back of Halls Close. To be clear, this development already has planning permission, but this was the first formal application. The development will certainly go ahead, but the meeting was to discuss the details of access, site layout, drainage, and so on. It was felt that many of these aspects were not yet satisfactory or acceptable and so the Committee has objected to the application in its present form. Its detailed response can be found on the Vale's website.

Grants were made in the previous month to DAMASCUS - £3500; to the Abingdon & District Citizens' Advice Bureau (which has supplied advice to a number of residents of Drayton) - £1000; and to the Stonehill Community Garden - £250. The PC is also paying the Football Club for cutting the grass on its pitch on a month by month basis.

Steve Sadler, our Village Caretaker, has unfortunately had to resign. Steve has had a number of health issues in recent years, and he has also now moved away from the village, which has made it difficult for him to continue. There is much more to the job than just picking up litter, and Steve has, amongst other tasks, cleared footpaths, painted railings, varnished benches, cleaned bus shelters, and done a whole lot more in his efforts to keep the village neat and tidy over the last 6 years. Thanks Steve, the PC really appreciates your hard work. There is now a vacancy for a <u>new caretaker</u>, and I believe there is a job advert elsewhere in this issue.

Financial Fraud

Financial fraud cost the UK £2 million per day last year according to official figures released by Financial Fraud Action UK (FFA UK). The figures show that the overall scale of financial fraud in 2016 was £768.8 million, an increase on the \pounds 755 million lost in 2015.

The '<u>**Take Five**</u>' campaign suggests five simple steps which consumers can follow in order to help to protect themselves from financial fraud.

1) Never disclose security details such as your PIN or full password - legitimate businesses will never ask you to do this.

2) Don't assume a phone call, e-mail or caller at your door is genuine - **people are not always who they say they are**.

3) Don't be rushed - a bank or genuine organisation won't mind waiting while you stop and think.

4) Listen to your instincts - if something feels wrong then it's usually right to pause and question it. There's an old saying, still valid, "if it looks too good to be true" (& you know the last bit!).

5) Stay in control - have the confidence to question and/or refuse unusual requests for information.

The Little Book of Cyber Scams

Thames Valley Police has worked with the Metropolitan Police to produce The Little Book of Cyber Scams. This forty-page booklet covers a wide range of cyber and cyber-enabled threats including malware and ransomware and social engineering attacks ie:- where cyber-crime is made possible by someone gathering data deceitfully, either in person, over the phone or by e-mail - and lots more.

While some of the information is aimed at businesses, <u>the</u> <u>advice is relevant to everyon</u>e. 

Yet Another Scam Doing the Rounds?!

Fraudsters have been advertising vehicles and machinery for sale on various selling platforms online. The victims, after communicating via email with the fraudster, will receive a bogus email which purports to be from an established escrow provider (a third party who will keep the payment until the buying and selling parties are both happy with the deal).

These emails are designed to persuade victims to pay upfront, via bank transfer, before visiting the seller to collect the goods. The emails also claim that the buyer (victim) has a cooling-off period to reclaim the payment if they change their mind. This gives victims the false sense of security that their money is being looked after by this trustworthy third party, when in fact it is not and the money has gone straight to the fraudster.

Protect yourself: When making a large purchase such as a new car or machinery, always meet the seller face to face first and ask to see the goods before transferring any money.


If you receive a suspicious email asking for payment, check for spelling, grammar, or any other errors, and check who sent the email. If in doubt, check feedback online by searching the associated phone numbers or email addresses of the seller.

Contact the third party the fraudsters are purporting to be using to make the transaction. They should be able to confirm whether the email you have received is legitimate or not.

False adverts often offer vehicles or machinery for sale well below market value to entice potential victims; always be cautious. If it looks too good to be true – you know the rest by now!


