



Recycling bin

What goes in it?

Collected every other week



Tin and steel cans, like drinks cans, soup and bean tins



Glass bottles and jars, any colour



Aerosols, like deodorant sprays



Fruit juice and milk cartons



Food trays – plastic AND clean foil!



Paper and card, like phone directories, newspapers and magazines



Plastic bottles, bags and pots like shower gel bottles, yoghurt pots and margarine tubs



Household batteries – put them in a clear bag on top of your bin



Old, tatty clothes and textiles – put them in a tied carrier bag next to your bin



Important!

NO Nappies and food waste – they can't be recycled. We won't empty your green wheelie bin if it has items that can't be recycled in it. Please put your recycling in loose or in a clear bag.



Rubbish bin

What goes in it?

Collected every other week



Nappies



Black bin liners



Clingfilm & salad bags



Polystyrene



Kitchen towels and tissues



Pet food pouches



Crisp packets



Sweet wrappers



Small unusable electrical items, like kettles, toasters, electronic toys, and radios – put them in a tied carrier bag next to your bin and we'll take them off for recycling

Food waste caddy


What goes in it?

All unpackaged food - cooked, raw, stale, as well as:


Collected every week



Any scraps or leftovers from your plate



Cooking oils, lards and fats



Bones and eggshells



Tea bags and coffee grounds



No more caddy liners? No problem!

If you run out of caddy liners, you can use a sheet of newspaper or put food in loose.

If you're missing any of these bins, they're broken or haven't been emptied, give us a call on 03000 610610 or visit www.more recycling.co.uk. We come and collect your bins around 7am, so make sure they're out before then - it's okay to put them out the night before. For a small yearly fee, we'll collect your garden waste from your kerbside. Remember - we suspend garden waste collections over Christmas to concentrate on the extra general waste around this time.



Bad weather? If snow or flooding makes it unsafe to empty your bins, we might need to cancel collections. If this happens, we'll let you know by issuing regular updates on our website and through our Twitter feeds.

Green recycling bin

Every other week



Extra, extra!

If you've got loads of recycling that won't fit in your bin, you can put out extra in an open cardboard box or clear bag next to your bin on your normal collection day.

What happens to this?

We sort it into the different materials and send this to UK companies to recycle into new products



Food waste caddy

Every week



Extra, extra!

Too much food waste? Put any extra in a food waste bag on top of your bin on your normal collection day.

What happens to this?

We process it at a facility in Oxfordshire, and farmers then use it to fertilise their crops. It also generates enough electricity for 4500 homes!



Grey rubbish bin

Every other week



Extra, extra!

Dont forget - small unusable electrical items can go out with your grey bin for recycling. Just put them in a tied carrier bag next to it.

What happens to this?

This goes to a facility where it's used to generate electricity. It also means 95% of Oxfordshire's general waste no longer goes to landfill.



Large item collection

Extra, extra!

If your large items are in decent shape, why not see if your local charity shop can give them a good home?

What happens to this?

Where we can we try and recycle items. This isn't always possible though, which is why we encourage you to see if you can pass bits and pieces of furniture on.



Brown garden waste bin

Every other week on the same day as your green bin



Extra, extra!

To make up for Christmas suspensions, we collect extra garden waste for one week in spring and autumn. Visit www.morerecycling.co.uk to find out more.
