

Letter from St Peter's

It has now just been over a couple of months since I moved to St Peter's. **We have felt very welcomed** into the community here – both the church and by members of the village. **Thank you**.

Moving house has been one of the main features of my life. My father was in the Army and we were posted all over Britain and Germany. I followed suit and also joined the Army after school with the hopes of travelling the world...only to be moved around a 50 miles radius of London!

After leaving the army I did a degree in Environmental Science in that famous seat of learning – Luton College. It was in Luton that I met David, my husband, who was a teacher. We led the church youth group together and the rest as they say is history. In the following years I followed him around the country as a vicar's wife, and full-time mum to four children.

The most adventurous journey of my life is the one that has brought me here to Drayton: discovering Jesus' love for me. As they talk about this, a stranger joins them. He asks them what's the matter and they tell him, and he walks with them all the way back to their home. They invite him in to share a meal. It is only when they set the table, prepared the food and sat down to eat that they realised—it's Him! It's their friend! It's Jesus! He then promptly disappears!

I like this story as **it shows that Jesus walks with us in dark times** and is always willing to listen to us without judging. Not only this, but it shows Jesus also has a sense of humour!

May **you** find God alongside you in the journeys of your life, supporting you in the dark times as well as being there in the celebration and fun.

WESTMINSTER VIEW



Ed Vaizey's column (Wantage MP; he's presently on the Commons Speaker's Advisory Panel on the Arts, also a patron of 'Kids in Museums')

After over 80 hours of debate and over 500 amendments and new clauses, the European Union Withdrawal Bill is now through the House of Commons and has

passed the first stage in the House of Lords. I submitted an amendment to the bill requiring Ministers to publish a plan on our future relationship with **Euratom**, the European Nuclear Energy authority. I was very pleased that my amendment had the most signatures of all amendments submitted and that as a result the government have agreed to publish a plan with quarterly updates.

Earlier this month I attended a meeting in Parliament on <u>rail in</u> <u>Oxfordshire</u>. It was a useful gathering of all the key stakeholders – Great Western, Chiltern, Network Rail, local councils and MPs.

First, the **good news**. We have a fantastic station in Didcot which provides excellent links to London, Swindon and Oxford. Didcot Parkway has gone from strength to strength in the last few years: a revamp, completed in 2014, made the station safer, and a bigger taxi rank, bus stop and cycle rack were just some of the improvements. Work shows no sign of slowing down, with an enclosed cycle rack in the works and the construction of a new multi-storey car park. Electrification of the line from London has now almost reached Didcot, cutting journey times on the fastest trains to 39 minutes. Great Western Railway's new, electric Intercity Express trains are being rolled out and will increase capacity by over 24% (648 vs 522 seats), something that any commuter to London will tell you is sorely needed. The driver training programme for the new trains has also been accelerated.

There is more to do though. It has been a long-standing ambition of mine to open a **station near Wantage**. There has been progress on this front recently. I have linked with other MPs to propose an East-West line which could include new stations in Wantage, Corsham and Royal Wootton Bassett. This would be an extension to the planned link between Cambridge & Oxford, and would help link Bristol, Swindon and Oxford. There are obstacles to be overcome in developing this proposal. The line between Didcot and Oxford particularly is almost at full capacity and we will need to think carefully about how to progresss this. It will still take many years, not least as we will have to build extra track.





CALLING council tax payers of White Horse the bank details have been changed for VoWHDC, which means changes

for some council tax and business rate payers, as part of extra security measures. The council has been given a new sort code which is 20-01-25, its bank account number remains the same.

The new sort code will affect people who pay their council tax or business rates by bank transfer or standing order. Those people are requested to update their payment details ASAP!

This change doesn't affect the majority of council tax payers, (the 81 per cent who pay by direct debit), as the new sort code will be amended as part of the direct debit service.

The new bank details and information on how to pay will be enclosed with council tax bills being issued in March.

FLY TIPPING Waste removal - how to stay legal.

If you pay someone to remove rubbish from your property and it's then fly-tipped, YOU could be prosecuted. By law you must make sure they are legitimate. A recent case (a chap was tracked down after dumping rubbish in Peep O'day Lane, that's between Drayton & Abingdon), saw fines and costs of £3,000 imposed.

Here's how to stay legal: 1) check they are a registered waste carrier, visit www.environment.data.gov.uk/public-register or you can call 03708 506 506; 2) get a written receipt/transfer note showing their contact details, a description of your waste, and details of where they are taking it; 3) note down the make, colour and reg number of the vehicle that's taking your waste away.

And remember, if their quote seems too cheap then it probably is! Make sure you get another quote, otherwise your rubbish could be fly-tipped and you'll end up in trouble!

RECYCLING – this county does well, but we COULD DO better! A recent survey said 16 to 34 yr-olds are the LEAST likely to recycle, so let's TRY HARDER?!! Here's one tip:- of kitchen waste, we recycle a mighty 90%, but that drops to just 50% in the bathroom, shampoo, conditioner, makeup, handwash & cleaning product bottles can ALL be recycled (please remove any pump).

Walnut Meadow Sports Pavilion

This year it is planned to start <u>raising the rest of the funds</u> for the sports facilities at Walnut Meadow. Subject to Miller Homes finishing the site and handing over the sports field land by summer 2018, it is planned to put in the field drainage and seed the grass this year so that the pitches are playable by Autumn 2020.

This means that the money for the sports pavilion and multiuse sports area (MUGA) needs to be raised this year so that building can be started in 2019, for completion in 2020.

The Pavilion is expected to cost around £800,000, plus £300,000 for the external works (including the car park); the MUGA up to £280,000, with an extra £35,000 for an optional exercise trail. The pitches (including seeding, drainage and equipment) are estimated at £360,000.

The financing for this total (£1.775k* excludes VAT which can be reclaimed by the Parish Council) is planned to come from three main sources:-

S106 Developers' Finance (paid as houses are built over next 3 years) - £975k

Public Works Loan Board Loan (see below) - £500k (reducing to £210k as S106 monies are received)

Grants from sports bodies, charities and local authorities - £500k Funds already raised: £90k

Public Works Loan Board / UK Debt Management Office

Loan >> In order for the project to start on time and to be viable Drayton Parish Council will need to take out a low interest public loan from the government's Treasury DMO/Public Works Loan Board (PWLB) and for this it needs the **public support** of the ratepayers in the village.

The loan will initially be a £500k loan over 25 years. The current rate of interest is about 3% meaning that the repayments over a 25 year period will cost £28,000 per year – a total cost of approx. £700k (£500k loan repayment and £200k interest).

The £28k p.a. capital and interest repayment will be paid for by the parish precept which is **already paid by each household** in the village. There will be **no need to further increase** the precept (which for 2018-19 is £85k for the village, or on average around £85 p.a. - £1.63 per week - per house) – but for the next few years about a third of the precept will need to be devoted to paying for the building of the Walnut Meadow sports facilities for the village. Subject to the rest of the funds being raised for the project the contribution from the precept will decrease, as it is intended to repay as much as the loan off as early as possible.

The **Annual Parish Assembly** to be held on Monday **April 9th** at 7pm will have this item on its Agenda. **Please come along** to discuss the **public loan** and the **sports facilities financing**.

Report of the Parish Council meeting held on Mon Feb 5th

Due to continuing road works along the Abingdon Road, the problem of drivers rat-running along Henleys Lane and Church Lane remains. Once again, a parishioner expressed concerns about the sheer quantity of two-way traffic using this route during peak periods. He feared the possibility of an accident, particularly on the blind bend connecting the two roads. Although the main problem is obviously caused by motorists not resident in either road hurrying to get to and from work, it does not help the situation when some of the residents have their own vehicles parked on the road. In some cases, this may be unavoidable, but residents are asked that, if at all possible, they park their cars offroad. This would also make life easier and safer for pedestrians.

As promised, a group of councillors met on Feb 12th to discuss possible ways to tackle this issue. These included:- making the route one-way only; blocking off access altogether at one end; and/or the use of additional speed humps in Church Lane. All the options have drawbacks and there is no perfect solution. However, those options considered most feasible will be worked up into a flyer which will be distributed to all residents in Henleys Lane and Church Lane, and some in Abingdon Rd and High Street. The recipients will be invited to respond with comments or offer alternative ideas. Needless to say, whatever scheme emerges from this process will still have to meet with the approval of the highway authorities.

Considerable debate took place regarding the recent meeting with residents of the Walnut Meadow development, the subject of which was the many problems they have been experiencing with construction work on the site which is sub-standard or incomplete. The meeting took place at the Village Hall, Jan 31st, and was attended by 5 parish councillors, our District and County councillors, and approx. 40 residents from the new development. It was agreed that the residents should draw up a list of grievances and present them to Millers (the developer) in a formal letter, demanding a clear timetable and deadlines as to when the outstanding works will be completed. The Parish Council will do likewise, in relation to those parts of the site that will become its responsibility in the future. The letters will be sent to the Chief Executive of Millers, based in Edinburgh, with copies to Ed Vaizey, our local MP. $\rightarrow >> \rightarrow$

Derek Stork from GARD spoke about the imminent publication of Thames Water's new long-term Water Management Plan. This has now been published, and it confirms that an Abingdon reservoir is still on the agenda, albeit it has been postponed to a time frame of 2035 - 2045. GARD believe this shift is something of a tactical retreat only, the significant fact being that the reservoir project has not been shelved, despite being rejected at a full public enquiry only a few years ago. Derek has written an update for the Chronicle in this issue, and readers are referred to this for more detail.

I should add that Huw Thomas from Thames Water has agreed to speak at the March PC meeting (see below) – although Huw has been invited specifically to talk about TW's plans to increase sewage and drainage capacity in Drayton in order to cope with all the new housing development.

A reminder that there are still two vacancies for councillors on the PC. Anyone interested is invited to attend the next meeting (see below) to see what goes on.

Assistance for vulnerable missing people – Herbert Protocol

A new tool to help find missing people with dementia was launched last month in partnership with search and rescue teams across the Thames Valley. The Herbert Protocol is a form to record key information about a person with dementia. This should be completed by carers or family members in case they go missing. Memory problems are one of a number of symptoms that people with dementia may experience, which can lead to feelings of confusion, fear and vulnerability and consequently can result in a person going missing.

Adopting the Herbert Protocol will help to ensure that the police and partner agencies, including the volunteer search and rescue teams, have the best possible information should someone with dementia go missing and a search needs to be conducted to find them. It will help avoid any unnecessary delays as the right information is immediately available. The form may include if the person is on medication, favourite places they like to visit or key people they know.

Recipe Time!

Microwave 'Steamed' Pudding (serves 4 to 6)

<u>Ingredients</u> 100g (4oz) self-raising flour, 2 medium eggs; 100g (4oz) butter, softened; 100g (4oz) caster sugar.

<u>Method</u> Lightly butter and flour a 900ml to 1.2 litre ($1\frac{1}{2}$ to 2 pints) pudding basin. Put all the ingredients into a food processor



and blitz until smooth. If necessary add a few drops of milk to give a soft consistency.

Sit the flavour of your choice (see below) in the base of the basin and spoon the sponge mixture on top. Cover with Clingfilm and pierce it with a knife.

In a 500-watt m'wave, cook on high for 4½ to 5 minutes, or until a skewer

pushed into the centre <u>comes out clean</u>. For every 100 watts above this, take about 15 seconds off the cooking time (i.e:- $3\frac{1}{2}$ to 4 minutes in a 1000 watt microwave). Now simply turn out and enjoy! (Ed's Note:- from decades of experience as a test-taster, custard or a spot of ice-cream may even enhance it!).

<u>Flavours</u> Spoon 2 to 3 tablespoons of golden syrup, jam, fruit curd, stewed apples or rhubarb into the base of the basin.

If you are making a **golden syrup, lemon curd or marmalade** pudding, add 1 or 2 tablespoons of the flavouring to the pudding mix itself for extra taste.

Add some finely grated lemon or orange zest to the mix itself.

For a rich chocolate pudding, replace 25g (1oz) of the four with cocoa powder and stir 100 to 225g (4 to 8oz) of grated plain chocolate into the mix. (Carol Arnold)
