Church Letter - from the Ministry Team...

Loneliness week - 17th to 21st June

Britain is in the midst of a loneliness epidemic. A survey by the Jo Cox Commission in 2017 revealed that nine million of us in the UK are affected by it. So, no wonder that last year the Government even appointed the world's first loneliness minister, Tracey Crouch. And no wonder that the Marmalade Trust aims to raise awareness of isolation in the UK. Loneliness hurts you physically as well as mentally. It has even been said that it can be as bad for your health as smoking 15 cigarettes a day. It can raise blood pressure, and cause diabetes and obesity. Technology is a big factor: we send emails rather than talk; we have virtual team workspaces rather than speaking in person. We use LinkedIn and Facebook to keep in touch. One health expert said, "We're getting out of the habit of actual conversations." People who work from home and who also live alone can go days without speaking to anyone. No wonder that the millennial generation, for whom technology accounts for an increasing percentage of their interaction, are reporting high levels of anxiety. Experts advise that you simply try and make as many social connections as you can, however brief. Make tea for someone at work, or chat to your neighbour. All our churches across the DAMASCUS Parish offer opportunities for meeting people and making friends - whether it's the Community Café in Sutton Courtenay; the weekly Pebbles Group in Drayton for Babies, Toddlers and their carers; Tea and Chat in Milton; the monthly coffee morning in Appleford or the Church Fete on the Village Green in Steventon coming up on 6th July; the summer holiday club for children or just meeting regularly for worship and fellowship on a Sunday morning. All these, and many more events are part of the fabric of our communities and help individuals to reach out to one another and extend the hand of friendship. The local elections saw the Conservatives lose our majority on both the Vale of White Horse District Council and South Oxfordshire District Council. I was very sad indeed to see so many hard-working local

councillors lose their seats, and new candidates who had been hoping to serve fail to achieve their goal.

The newly elected councillors will face similar challenges to those they are replacing, and there are no easy answers. I have always worked with politicians of all parties to get the answers we need locally and will continue to lobby central government for the support that we need.

Many councillors who lost their seats will rightly blame Westminster. While local issues are very important, there is no doubt that voters use them to send a message to government. I will be taking the message of frustration felt on the doorstep of the campaign and at the ballot box back to Westminster: it is wrong that local politicians who have worked tirelessly for their local communities should bear the brunt of a Westminster failure.

I am working with the AEA Technology Pension Campaign is to secure the pension rights of scheme members that may be otherwise lost because AEA Technology entered a pre-pack administration. Richard (Dick) Barnes, co-designer of the Harwell Dekatron computer, died aged 98 on 8 April 2019.



Although a few years later than the mechanical 'bombes' and the electronic 'colossus' at Bletchley Park, the Dekatron was also invaluable then and has proved just as interesting; more unique in many respects, not least because Mr. Barnes and his coworkers chose to work in our (natural) arithmetic base 10 (hence Dekatron) rather than the

base 2 which later became universal in computers.

His Dekatron was essentially one of the world's first programmable calculators, designed to do the calculations necessary for Britain's nuclear weapons development which were done at Harwell at the time by staff using mechanical calculators.

The Dekatron was not only rather faster than a skilled human calculator but had the enormous merit of working day and night without getting tired or making mistakes, a real 24/7 machine as we now say. Mr. Barnes' Dekatron subsequently spent many years

Computing at Bletchley Park as the world's oldest, original, working computer.

Interest in it is now encouraging more bright young people into science and engineering and, in that sense, its full impact is only now becoming apparent.

Few of us are able to do something which achieves so much for Britain's science and engineering enterprises over such a long period of time and ends up as such a national treasure.

I was privileged to work with Dick Barnes at Harwell, though never closely, and also to follow him as an editor of the newspaper that he and another of our old Harwell colleagues started in the village where he then lived, and I now live.

The Drayton Chronicle, as they named it and we saw no reason to change, has many excellent features of style, content, business model etc. which had been set by Barnes and Bisby. Dick himself set its tone at the start by researching and writing a series of articles about the history of Drayton which helped the village, as it grew rapidly to house the scientists joining Harwell and the other companies now comprising 'Science Vale', to develop an ethos and identity which is still apparent in the Chronicle.

I leave others to highlight Mr. Barnes' other contributions as a local historian in the Vale of White Horse. Without doubt he was a great contributor to both British and Oxfordshire Society.

Thames Valley Police service satisfaction survey

Each month Thames Valley Police will be sending text messages to around 10,000 people who have contacted them to report either an incident or a crime. People will be asked to provide feedback on the response they received, which will help the police to better understand the effectiveness of their response and how they might improve the service. The survey is voluntary, but it's hoped that, if they receive a text, members of the public will take part by answering the two questions which comprise the survey. It's an expansion of the more in-depth telephone survey, for which there's currently an overall satisfaction rate of 78.1%. Texts will not be sent relating to any crimes and incidents of a sensitive nature, such as domestic abuse.

Important information to note:

Texts are at the provider's standard rate.

You can be sure the text is genuine if it comes from 07860020479. People can opt-out of the survey or withdraw their consent for the police to use their response. More information and the police's privacy notice can be found on the police website at https://www.thamesvalley.police.uk/survey.

Being burgled is a traumatic experience. It's not just the financial cost of replacing stolen items but also the emotional impact of feeling violated after a burglar's been in your home. You can reduce the risk of becoming a victim by looking at your own home security through a burglar's eyes. Consider how you'd break in if you locked yourself out. GARD UPDATE



Many thanks to the fiftyplus local people who came along to the recent GARD Annual General Meeting. Many more of you have also submitted responses to the Affinity Water consultation (thanks for copying to us). This is really important because, barring a Public

Inquiry, this was the last chance for the public to object to plans for the reservoir until sometime around 2022/23. The big news is that the water regulator, Ofwat, is now allowing the Southeast water companies to raise £350 million on customers' bills, to fund research into alternative supply options. Given the lack of detailed information on any option, including the reservoir, we broadly welcome this initiative. We do believe the studies could be done at a much lower cost and been less of a burden on customers' bills – such a large sum would run a significant consultancy company for several years. We would also much prefer that the work be conducted by independent experts, rather than the water companies themselves. But it's a start.

Thames Water and Affinity Water have been jointly allocated over £150 million and we believe our major task, over the next 2 years, is to make sure they study all of the alternatives thoroughly and not just use it to subsidise development of the reservoir.

The output of the studies will be a key input as to whether the reservoir goes ahead as an option. If you would like to join GARD at £10 for lifetime membership, please email gard.secretary@gmail.com for information.

Help endangered Stag Beetles this summer



Creating log piles and recording sightings of adult stag beetles (or larvae), are just two ways you can help endangered stag beetles – Britain's largest land beetle (pictured above) – this summer.

Stag beetles are found throughout Western Europe and are relatively widespread in southern England, particularly along the Thames Valley and parts of Essex, Suffolk, Hampshire and West Sussex. There are also known populations in the Severn Valley, but elsewhere in Britain they are very rare or possibly even extinct. Areas with chalky soils, such as the South Downs, or areas where the average air temperature is low and rainfall is high, such as the north of England, are unlikely to be home to stag beetles.

County Report



Oxfordshire is a major contributor to the national exchequer. It is therefore understandable that Government wishes to capitalize on the County's economic success. This push for further rapid economic growth has been behind the proposals for the Expressway, the Reservoir and, via the "Growth Deal", the push for accelerated housing growth. For many, it has seemed a

little desperate – a push for Growth at all costs and impossible or irresponsible to challenge.

But two things have happened to change the argument. The first and most important by far was the UN Report on climate change. The impact on Carbon output of major road building, reservoir building, and quarrying has been little considered up to now. It is now under a sharp spotlight. Major infrastructure projects will now have to justify themselves in terms or carbon output. Some may well fail that test.

The second recent occurrence was our own local elections in Oxfordshire. Until then, Government had had a reasonably free ride with Councils, mostly of the same political persuasion, being ready and willing to accept vast infrastructure projects and accelerated housing growth in return for the £215m offered by the Growth Deal. With two of Oxfordshire's Councils changing hands, that assumed willingness is cast into doubt. Many questions will be asked, not least challenging the figures (the SHMA figures) on which all this growth is predicated.

Every decision of the Growth Board (the Leaders of all Oxfordshire's councils) will have to be scrutinized very carefully. The way the Growth Board operates (with major decisions being made out of the public eye) is likely to have to change.

With a government under so much pressure on other fronts, it is at least likely that there will have to be a pause for reflection on the "Growth at all costs" agenda.

I have no doubt Oxfordshire residents will welcome that.

Last month we had an amazing speaker; his name is John



Coldacott and he spoke about the Coram Trust. We had not heard of this trust, but he told us it was older than Barnardo's with John Coram, its founder, shocked by the number of sick dead and abandoned children on the streets of

London. So, in 1722 he began taking in street children and babies, there were so many that he opened a house for their support. He gained support from the Duchess of Somerset, and George II but it took 17 years so get help through the government. A sum of £10,000 was raised and they purchased first property which was in Hatton Garden, and is still there today. Thomas left the organization, and it carried on getting bigger and bigger, space was balloted for and no second baby was accepted. 14,000 children applied to enter in the four hospitals, but it became impossible to cope, so, they had to revert to a ballot system. The trust owned a lot of land in central London, (many of the famous desirable square are now built there) and a very large school was built in Berkhamsted in 1935 The new build had all mod cons but no love or toys. Babies were fostered out until the age of five then handed back to the school. The education act brought this strict regime to an end. Mr Coldacott finished by telling us he was a Coram boy and he brought his uniform to show us, it was black serge with a red waistcoat designed by William Hogarth, it was so heavy poor boys wearing that suit.

Our next meeting is on Thursday June 13th at 7.30pm and we will be told about preparing for an emergency, let's hope we never need it.

Chronicle Funding - Lottery

All dwellings in the village are supposed to receive the Drayton Chronicle each month. This service costs money and has been funded by advertisement sales and the sale of lottery tickets. The editors and distributors of the Chronicle met recently to discuss this funding. We have been aware for some time that income was not keeping up with costs.

The size of it has become larger (often 20 pages), we are now using colour, and the distribution is increasing from around 1000 to an expected 1500 due to the extra building work in and around the village. We have traditionally been using the monthly lottery sales to supplement income, but not enough were being purchased and it is quite costly and labour intensive to run. It is thus, with some regret, that we have decided to stop selling lottery tickets and the last draw will be in the July issue. If you have purchased tickets in advance then you will be offered a refund, or you may leave it as a donation.

We shall be applying to the Parish Council for financial support since we consider the Chronicle to be a service to the village.

Over the last few years we have been extremely grateful to Colin and Carol Arnold for their dedication to the organisation of the lottery and the distribution of the Chronicle. Fortunately, they will be staying on to continue to supervise the distribution.
