# DRAYTON (ABINGDON) PARISH COUNCIL – RIGHTS OF WAY AND CONSERVATION WORKING GROUP – TERMS OF REFERENCE

Date Last Agreed: 16<sup>th</sup> May 2011 Date of Next Review: May 2012

## **Objective:**

The Rights of Way and Conservation Working Group (ROW) is responsible to the Parish Council for maintaining the Drayton village footpaths, bridleways and byways in good order.

#### Membership:

- 1. Membership of the ROW Working Group is established at the Annual Parish Meeting in May each year.
- 2. The Rights of Way and Conservation Group (ROW) comprises up to five Councillors.
- 3. One of the members of the ROW Working Group is elected annually by the Parish Council as its chairman.
- 4. Co-opted Councillors may join during the year if authorised by Parish Council at a monthly meeting; of the Council
- 5. Members from outside bodies may be invited to join the Committee. These persons do not have a right to vote or to move or second a motion (as per Standing Orders).
- 6. Three members shall constitute a quorum for meetings.

### **Meetings**

7. Meetings of the ROW Working Group are to be held as and when required in order to consider matters relevant to the Group's objectives.

#### **Decision/Delegated Powers:**

- 8. By regularly using/inspecting paths the ROW working group shall ensure that all footpaths and bridleways within the parish are well sign-posted and passable, that when necessary overgrowth and fallen trees etc. are removed and that stiles, gates and kissing gates are kept in good repair.
- 9. The ROW working group shall ensure that all the most well used footpaths within the village itself are kept as far as possible in usable condition even when wet.
- 10. If footpaths need to be cut back, fallen trees removed, surfaces or stiles repaired the matter may be referred to the village caretaker, the landowner or, if a large and difficult job, to the Environment and Economy Department of the OCC.
- 11. If necessary landowners are to be reminded of their legal duty to reinstate all paths promptly after ploughing and sowing crops.
- 12. The ROW Working Group should whenever possible ensure that hedgerows alongside footpaths and bridleways are maintained as good wildlife habitat, and may initiate projects to enhance wildlife habitat
- 13. Should a property owner need to be remove a hedgerow for building access the ROW Working Group must ensure that the householder reinstates the hedge.
- 14. The ROW Working group is to ensure that footpaths and bridleways are used for their designated purposes i.e.
  - Footpaths for those on foot only
  - Bridleways for those on foot, horseback or bicycle
  - Byways where there is right of way for vehicles but which are mainly used as footpaths or bridleways.
