From the DAMASCUS Ministry Team

I could do with a holiday this summer

June, the start of our meteorological summer, when our hopes turn to restful warm sunny days in the garden or perhaps going on holiday. Looking forward to a much needed break from the gloom of the crises and threats which surround us, or the gloom of the weather and our tiredness.

<u>Pentecost</u> heralds the start of summer – the time when the church remembers and gives thanks for God's gift of His life giving, life enhancing, Spirit. To the early church, God sent His Holy Spirit to be their strength in times of human weakness and vulnerability. As our energy, faith and hope diminishes, Pentecost reminds us again that God's strength is made perfect in our weakness.

Pentecost makes me realise that our sense of emptiness is not a negative thing, it is a capacity.

We read on containers the capacity they hold. Capacities are there to be filled. Without the Holy Spirit we are nothing. It is only through the Holy Spirit, God within us, that we come to believe in God's refreshing love. It is only through the Holy Spirit that we can pray at all; for true prayer is always the Holy Spirit praying in and through us. It is only through the Holy Spirit that we are capable of any genuine good, for that which is of God within us is good. Without the Holy Spirit we are an emptiness. But this emptiness is a capacity waiting to be filled.

W.J. Carey, Bishop of Bloemfontein (1921-1934), wrote a prayer which he suggested should be 'prayed slowly; or brooded over; or thought and felt.'

This prayer includes the lines: 'O Holy Spirit of God – come into my heart and fill me ... I offer to thee the one thing I really possess, my capacity of being filled by thee.... Fill me so that I may live the life of the Spirit; the life of truth and goodness, the life of beautyand guide me today in all things.'

Vacancies

From the PC part of the DraytonVillage website: There is presently a vacancy for a Part-time Parish Clerk & Responsible Financial Officer (see https://www.draytonvillage.co.uk), this due to Lorraine Watling's departure before Xmas.

There are currently **five vacancies** for Councillors on Drayton Parish Council. This unpaid position involves working for the local community as part of a team of 11 Councillors.

The Council's work is varied and interesting, it's organised into topic areas ie:- Finance and Personnel, Neighbourhood Development Plan implementation, Planning, Rights of Way, Transport, etc. Councillors often undertake work on their topic, and may attend meetings between the regular monthly ones.

Any resident over the age of 18 can apply to join the council, as can non-residents with substantial links to the parish. The elections team at the Vale of White Horse District Council or the 'temp, acting' Parish Clerk (**Dianne Rickaby**) can provide further information about eligibility.

If you can help deliver the work of the Council, and would like to be considered for this position, please email an expression of interest to:- clerk@draytonpc.org Your email should include a few lines about yourself, describing your links to the Parish, your skills and interests, and how you feel you can contribute to the Parish Council's work within the community. You may also be asked to address the Council at the meeting when your application for co-option is considered.

Soooo, if you'd like to serve the village, and help with important decisions, then this is **your chance**?!

To contact any members of the Parish Council, all enquiries should be directed to the (temp) **Parish Clerk**, as above, and messages will be passed on. Any Drayton resident may also ask to be added to the Clerk's E-mailing list, so that they receive prior notice of meetings and any relevant documents.

PC Meeting Update

Drayton Parish Council held its annual meeting on 16th May. A new Chair was elected (Richard Wade) and lead members elected for the main areas of work. Some of the issues discussed were:- **Refurbishment of the Eastway footpath**. The contractor has been back several times to rectify issues. We are now waiting to see how the path fares after some dry weather.

- **Sports facilities at Walnut Meadow**. Miller Homes now have planning permission to re-level the sports pitch area. We have therefore been able to select the architect to design the pavilion.
- The Council is in discussion with Cala Homes regarding the transfer of the public open space at Manor Farm. We are also starting to look more widely at developing a strategy for management of parish council owned open spaces across the village.
- The Council has 5 vacancies and at the present time we are able to co-opt new members. Perhaps you have a burning issue that you wish to work on or just want to help make the village a better place in a very small way. You would be very welcome to join the Council. CALLING TREASURERS (Clubs & Small Groups)

Bank Accounts, a tricky topic these days, so many banks don't seem interested, or seem to charge quite ridiculous fees, that while service levels are on the slide?

DO CHECK OUT the Community Current Account at METRO BANK, (for Clubs, Societies & Charities) which looks like it could be FREE (200 transactions a month) barring bounced cheques, or perhaps if you needed to 'stop' one you'd written? Yearly Turnover needs to be less than £250,000, looks plenty for most such accounts?

The monthly allowance of free transactions includes all manner of DDs. Standing Orders. Bill payments. Cheques in and out (you can pay them in at the Post Office), and 200 should be more than enough for most such accounts per month? They've some Savings/deposit accounts too.

Nearest branches are Oxford & Newbury, should only be needed when setting up an a/c? [NB A few other banks do have such accounts, let Google be your friend!]

Old School - 1960?

Dear Editor,

via Facebook

Hello to all. My first post (this was extracted from the 'Families' Facebook page). I am from <u>Tennessee</u>. I lived on High Street for a year as a 10 year old with my family of six on an old farm in 1960 I believe. There were 14 cats there and we had a name for each one.

If any old-timers or new-to-be-made acquaintances see this and care to respond, I would love to hear from you.


I am 71 now, but still have vivid memories of that year. And I also still have all my old Dinky and Corgi toys!

Local Elections

District Council elections were held on May 4th. I know these tend to be more exciting for Councillors and candidates than for most people, but they do act to provide the District Council for the next four years. I've very pleased to have been re-elected for a further four years and I'd like to thank everyone who voted for me – thank you! I am very

aware I represent all of you, regardless of who you voted for or if you voted at all, and I'll continue to do my best to work for you.

The **District Council** is responsible for:-

Planning Services (Planning applications, Local Plans, and Enforcement); Environmental Services (Bins and recycling, street cleaning, food safety, public health, monitoring air quality and contamination, and licencing activities); Housing Services (Housing advice, managing the housing register, arranging temporary accommodation, grant and loan applications, Housing Benefit and Council Tax Benefit, community safety, housing standards); Cultural and Recreational Services (Sports and leisure services, parks and open spaces, community arts development, grant aid to local groups); Transport Services (assisted travel schemes, licencing for taxis, car parks), & Other Services (Elections, electoral registration, Council tax collection, pest control, abandoned vehicles).

The roads (including potholes!), schools and education services, social services, fire service, trading standards, waste management, libraries, and museums are all under the **County Council**, not the District Council. I still think we need to merge them together to get a Unitary Council so that it's much clearer who does what,

The elections have resulted in a change to the make-up of the Council. There are now 34 Lib Dem Councillors and 4 Green Councillors. The Conservatives lost their six seats and are now no longer represented on the District Council, so the Greens will be the official Opposition. There are still no Labour Councillors, or Independents (or members of any other parties, for that matter).

VofWHDC Elections 2023: Aggregate Votes:

Lib Dems: 20,772, = 55.5% (34 seats, up 3) Conservatives: 10,233, = 27.3% (0 seats, down 5)

Greens: 3,939, = 10.5% (4 seats, up 3) Labour: 2,279, = 6.1% (0 seats, no change)

Independents/Others: 201, = 0.5% (0 seats, no change)

The rather strange distribution of seats to votes (Conservatives have no seats on 27% whilst Greens have 4 seats on 10%) is due to the **First-Past-The-Post voting system**. Although my party is benefiting from this here in the Vale (just see the seats and vote share percents), I am concerned that there are a lot of people in the Vale not represented by a party of their preference. All of us, no matter which party we stand for, should remember that we represent **everyone** in the Vale.

The first official meeting of the new District Council is occurring on May 17th (past the deadline, so I'll report on it next time).

As the Cost of Living crisis hasn't gone away, I'm once again putting in the contact details for support for individuals and families from the Community Hub.

Parish Council

The Parish Council has also been re-elected. However, despite Drayton being entitled to eleven Parish Councillors, only six people stood. Fortunately, they are very capable people, but they could do with some help. **There are five vacancies**, and I urge everyone to consider stepping forwards. The Parish Council is responsible for:-

Co-ordinating and implements issues to do with the Drayton Neighbourhood Plan, including the new sports pavilion, sports facilities, proposing traffic calming measures (in co-ordination with the County Council), footpath refurbishment, and tree planting, as well as local art, open spaces, and bio-diversity. Plus Reviewing and commenting on Drayton planning applications, Management and maintenance of playgrounds, allotments, the burial ground, some other public land, and street furniture.

The <u>Parish Councillors are unpaid volunteers</u>, and I have always been impressed with how hardworking they are for the community, as well as extremely competent. They've been absolutely invaluable on scrutinising and putting the pressure on Miller Homes for the Walnut Meadows site, amongst many other issues, but with only six, they're likely to be more overworked than ever!

Reservoir

In last month's article, I mentioned that a national journalist came down to speak to the chair of GARD and representatives of interested local groups, as well as myself. The article was published in the Observer in April, and I thought it was a very fair article. It's called "Lake or mistake? The row over water firms, drought and Abingdon's new super-reservoir", see:-

RAPID – the regulatory body in charge of the major water infrastructure projects – published its draft recommendations. As it turns out, it avoided making any decisions and appears to have allowed almost every major project through to Gate 3. This is deeply disappointing – RAPID were supposed to eliminate "suboptimal solutions" at Gate 2, now appear to have considered virtually every option as being "optimal"! It does feel like the water companies are in the driving seat rather than the regulator.

Gate 3 will require developed design and finalised feasibility studies. There will be a further checkpoint in December 2023, so the fight continues.

Electric Car Club Pilot Scheme

Local Authorities across Oxfordshire have partnered with car club providers Co Wheels, Enterprise CarClub, and Thame EV Car Hire to offer **pay-per-use EVs on a 12-month trial basis**. The scheme gives people the chance to access an electric vehicle when they need one, without the expense of owning or leasing one outright. Car clubs can make it more affordable for people who do not drive every day and they provide real-world experience of driving electric without a long-term commitment. Details are available at:-

GARD

GARD's Annual General Meeting took place on Tuesday May 2nd in Steventon Village Hall, well attended from across the region.

Where are we now with the proposals and responses? There will be news in June.

We await the responses of WRSE, Thames Water and RAPID to our opposition. Responses to RAPID's draft decision have been sent from Stakeholders (i.e. GARD, OCC, the Vale, Parish Councils, Wantage and Grove Campaign Group).

RAPID wishes both the Reservoir and the competing Severn Thames Transfer to move on to the next stage of evaluation but GARD believes that the Reservoir should not be allowed to proceed for further evaluation UNTIL a proper public assessment of the Reservoir's safety and flood risk potential has been carried out and published.

GARD is considering the next moves and needs to build a fighting fund. We will possibly have to consider a legal challenge. We shall continue to work on publicity and increasing opposition support, perhaps via a petition.

We ask YOU to continue lobbying your MP and Councillors, and we'd urge all members and supporters to please consider a contribution to our campaign fund.

The proposed Reservoir has no justification and, as Oxfordshire CC stated in its January 2023 Press Release, it's "a destructive scheme, both environmentally and in its impacts on local people".

Commissioner Scrutiny panel. There I meet Councillors from all around the Thames Valley area to discuss how we should hold the Commissioner to account.

The reputation of our police has taken quite a battering largely as a result of happenings in the Met. As we are the nearest neighbours to the Met, we might have expected that similar problems might spill over from the Met area into the Thames Valley. I am happy to report that I have seen little sign of this. Indeed, I have been very impressed with the determination shown by our Chief Constable and his team of Deputies in dealing with potential problems of misogyny, racism, bullying and the like.

A recent BBC documentary on some of the behaviour at the UN where there were accusations of bad behaviour running right up to the top of the organisation, made me realise just how important it is for the public to have confidence in large organisations that senior management is open, transparent and honest over any shortcomings. The moment that there is any sign of cover up, the reputation of the whole organisation is threatened. This is why I was much reassured by discussions with the senior Thames Valley Police team.



<u>I do hope you all enjoyed the Coronation weekend</u>. Whether I was in Wantage, Didcot, Grove or Wallingford, the mood was upbeat, people were

having a good time and there was plenty of food, music and activities. The Coronation itself passed off perfectly, despite the weather – and the concert was great too. It was another reminder of how this country can do events like this better than anywhere else.

While we're still crunching the data, **I wanted to thank everyone who completed my health services survey**. We had nearly 3,000 responses, which is a really great number to give a picture of what people are feeling across the constituency.

It's clear that, as I expected and as my inbox reflects, many people feel we do not have the health services we need. Nor do I. People particularly struggle to get an appointment with a doctor or with a dentist, but this is not the only thing that people would like to see more of when it comes to health. I will continue to campaign hard on this – watch this space.

After I held a <u>successful crime summit</u> with Thames Valley Police in Wantage, I was asked by local residents to hold one in **Wallingford**. Wherever you live, you can also sign up there for my **third annual climate summit**, which will be via Zoom and will have Grant Shapps, Secretary of State for Energy Security and Net Zero, giving the keynote speech.

Sticking with the environment and climate change, I continue to lobby for the **Local Electricity Bill**, of which I am the lead sponsor and which is now backed by 318 MPs. This would make it easier for small, community organisations that generate renewable energy to be able to sell it to the community. I am hopeful that with the Government's Energy Bill making its way through parliament at the moment, we might be able to finally make something happen that enables community energy to flourish.

Thanks to everyone who took part in my **Apprenticeship Fair** in Didcot – nearly 400 people attended and had great conversations with a range of public and private employers about the range of apprenticeships they offer. I was asked if I will be doing it again and I will be doing so.

A couple of other things in brief. I met with the Chair of Water Resource South East to again convey the objections local people have about the reservoir proposal.

And I continue to encourage people to see if they are <u>eligible</u> for **Pension Credit**, which can provide an average £3,500 a year to pensioners. The figures show the uptake locally is increasing, but there are more people who could be getting it. **See if YOU or someone else you know is eligible** here:-

Down the Years



So, for this occasional venture back into the <u>Pop</u> <u>Chart annals</u>, who was charting <u>THIS time of year</u>, going back through time? <u>Remember these</u>? >>

In 2013, this month had seen 'Get Lucky' (Daft Punk with Pharrell Williams) moving to be the year's biggest seller, with 'Blurred Lines' (Robin Thicke, 'featuring' T.I. & Pharrell Williams again) at #1, that track just in the news lately (due to the Ed Sheeran alleged plagiarism case), and in 2015 it was deemed sufficiently similar to a Marvin Gaye song ('Got to Give it Up') that half the royalties had to be handed over to the Gaye estate!

Back 20 years & S Club reached #2 with 'Say Goodbye' – which quite accurately WAS their last chart hit. Also charting were the Cheeky Girls ('Take My Shoes Off') – their 2nd hit – and in the next 18 months they'd have hits with a Cheeky Holiday, Christmas, and Flamenco.

Back to **1993** – and soon to be #1 was **Freddie Mercury**, with 'Living On My Own', substantially remixed from the original minor hit, and ironically his first solo number one, almost exactly two years after his death.

40 years ago (is it REALLY so long?!) and we'd just had the **Police** at #1 ('Every Breath You Take'), high in the charts were **Irene Cara** ('Flashdance – What a Feeling'), and **David Bowie** ('China Girl'), with **Paul Young** at #1 with 'Wherever I Lay my Hat (That's my Home)', , ,but shouldn't the title have been Wherever I HANG my hat?!

Plus - the fantastic **Eurythmics** were in the charts (Who's That Girl), with **KC & the Sunshine Band** ('Give It Up'), and **Elton John** ('I'm Still Standing' – and ironically he STILL just about is, though sadly it seems his voice is on crutches, but then he is a little matter of 76?!).

FIFTY years ago (for real old-timers), Sweet had just charted ('Hell Raiser'), with two great number One hits, Suzi Quatro ('Can The Can'), and the wonderful 10CC ('Rubber Bullets'), followed by the melodic duo of Leonard Sargent & Dianne Littlehales, better known as Peters & Lee ('Welcome Home'), who had won Opportunity Knocks umpteen times, and would headline the Royal Variety show that year. Lennie Peters was an uncle of Charlie Watts (Stones drummer of course) & his teaming up with Lee became incredibly successful, with their own TV show, guest spots on many more, hits and albums galore, until they split up in 1980.

Just below them in the charts were **Hotshots** ('Snoopy versus the Red Baron') and **David Bowie** again ('Life on Mars'). Coming up behind them was the wonderful voice of the ill-fated **Karen Carpenter** ('Yesterday Once More'), and the **Osmonds** were Goin' Home.

Anyone recall 1963?! <u>Let me help</u>:- In just a few weeks, an <u>incredible set of records charted</u>, **Billy J Kramer (and the Dakotas!)** and their 'Do You Want To Know a Secret', with **Ray Charles** & 'Take These Chains From My Heart'. Also **Gerry & the Pacemakers** ('I Like It'), the **Crystals** ('Da Doo Ron Ron'), the **Searchers** ('Sweets for my Sweet'), **Elvis** ('You're The Devil in Disguise'), a new record for consecutive hits - and the **Surfaris** ('W-W-W-W-W-W-Wipe Out') with that iconic, amazing drum solo.
