ST PETER'S LETTER

From the Ministry Team...

Dear Friends

This year I find myself thinking about Christmas every time I hear or see the news. Reports of terrible suffering bring a sober challenge to how the historical events around Bethlehem have been turned into a Festivitymas by consumer excess. News and images of young migrants forced to move from their place of birth with no secure abode once they arrive at their destination. Political and military threat surround the population: poverty in body and spirit are everywhere. Few have secure homes or places to stay. Infants are the most vulnerable, but the despised, the outsiders are hardly better off as they eke out a meagre existence in the wild, harsh hillsides.

To the world 2000+ years ago comes the same message as today: 'Do not be afraid, I bring you good news.' The first to hear such news are the innocent, the vulnerable, the ordinary and the despised. The most precious word for this Christmas is the same as 2000 years ago; it is *Emmanuel -* God is with us. I pray that this Christmas we do not 'spend' Christmas or 'observe' Christmas but rather 'keep' it and 'share' it.

Christmas/sacred Christ/massacred – where do I draw the line?

When the song of the angels is stilled, when the star in the sky is gone,

When the kings and princes are home, when the shepherds are back with their flock,

The work of Christmas begins: to find the lost, to heal the broken, to feed the hungry, to release the prisoner, to rebuild the nations,

To bring peace among brothers, to make music in the heart. Howard Thurman's poem "The Work of Christmas"

GARD Newsletter for December 2023

GARD has written to the Secretary of State for DEFRA (Steve Barclay) to ask him to confirm the timetable for his decision on the Thames Water plans, and particularly for the Mega-Reservoir. Our information on the grapevine is that this will be around the end of November. We will let all residents know his decision (Newsletter or Village website).

Until then, GARD will continue to send in our list of **Unresolved Issues** about the Reservoir plan, which Thames Water refuse to answer properly. Looking at TW's "Statement of Response", GARD finds that they did not actually answer criticisms properly. **If you feel that they have not answered complaints you made to Thames Water in the consultation, you can write to the Environment Agency and/or Ofwat and complain. This should be done as soon as possible, so it can inform the Secretary of State's decision.** Email your complaint to one of these and please **Copy** to your MP and to GARD:


In the meantime, Thames Water are on a 'charm offensive' trying to sell the Reservoir plans to local residents. They were met by protesters at their 'Drop-in event' at East Hanney Village Hall on 10th November, when Councillor Sally Povolotsky and Helen Marshall (Oxfordshire Director for CPRE) were interviewed by Press and TV. Thanks to all protesters, including other Vale and Parish Councillors from Steventon, East Hanney and East Hendred. Thames Water gave the usual PR-based presentation (not a bulldozer in sight on any of the posters, one assumes the work will be done by birds and butterflies). We are promised 'leisure facilities' (which we already have, and which they have no idea how they will provide, after devastating the area), but our questions on disruption, pollution, flooding and safety of the structure were brushed aside. We must keep up the pressure for the Reservoir plans to be scrapped!

COUNTY COUNCIL **REPORT**



Are we losing the ability to disagree constructively? For much of the past month, I have been fielding questions/concerns and sometimes abuse over transport and highway issues. From Oxford's LTN's (about which I can do very little) to 20mph zones (which I fully support) these issues provoke strong feelings. Of course they matter, but with our social services under evermore financial strain, and a cost of living crisis that will not go away, it is interesting, and a bit depressing, that potholes and restrictions on traffic speed seem to dominate the local agenda.

There has, however, been good news (most agree).

The delivery of the long-awaited Drayton Road Build out in Sutton Courtenay together with the new SID (speed indicator devices) will, we hope, go some way to improving the accident statistics and quality of life along that road - similar hopes for the new SID at Appleford Railway Bridge.

The completion of the Mill Road bridge in Marcham will allow greater access to the countryside for residents of Marcham and Drayton once the weather co-operates.

Work continues to resolve County and District planning issues in Drayton.

Work between District and County Councils on the Joint Vale and South Local Plan continues apace. New government allowing, we are hopeful that Housing delivery targets will be more modest than many we're expecting.

Whatever the numbers are, planning enforcement is in dire need of reform. Many councils do not have the resources to provide a decent service. Too few enforcement officers and a set of regulations lacking teeth, have steadily eroded public confidence in the planning system. Too often planning conditions side-stepped and even ignored, weak penalties for abuse, an endlessly forgiving system over retrospective planning applications and overlong time given to applicants to comply with conditions, have all resulted in a general perception that planning is entirely in the hands of developers rather than planning authorities. It is time for a wholesale revision of planning regulations to restore public confidence in the system.

The Thames Water plans for a Reservoir rumble on. Thames Water would now like the reservoir to be even larger. Most local residents would like the whole idea to be shelved. 2024 may well turn out to be decisive.

And finally, has anyone else noticed the enormous increase in the local squirrel population? We now have a family who have settled in under our eaves and are becoming increasingly assertive. There is one who looks back in through our window in the mornings, with a look of defiance on its face having spent the night chewing through the wire mesh, moth balls and polystyrene filler we have used to try to fill its access points. Using poison which birds and pets can pick up, we are told, is illegal and I don't own a blunderbus. We are now trying "pigeon spikes" – potentially turning the house into a prison camp. LETTER FROM WESTMINSTER



Thank you very much to the 2,127 people who signed my petition to re-open Grove Station. It shows again the huge strength of feeling on this locally, and I will now be presenting it to the House of Commons and to the Department for Transport to make the case to them. Thanks too to Andy Holding of the Wantage and Grove Rail Supporters Group for his support. I will keep pushing for this station, which makes economic, social, and environmental sense.

We are the proud home of the 11 EOD and Search Regiment at Vauxhall Barracks in Didcot, and it was a pleasure to visit again and meet Lt Col Rob Swan and the team. Just this year they have so far responded to more than 1,800 requests in the UK to deal with explosive devices and I planted a remembrance stake in Parliament's Garden of Remembrance in their honour. I also, as ever, took part in poignant remembrance services and parades this year in Wantage and Didcot. Thank you to everyone who made them happen.

UK Parliament Week takes place every November, and I was pleased to visit local schools and talk to different youth organisations about my role as an MP and how they can get involved in politics, including: Wallingford School, St Michael's CofE Primary School in Steventon, Brightwell Primary School, St Blaise Primary School, the 7th Abingdon Beavers, Chilton Explorer Scout Unit and Brightwell cum Sotwell Scouts.

I have been campaigning to improve our roads since I was elected and I have now launched my Local Roads Survey to give you the opportunity to tell me exactly where you are seeing issues on our roads that need to be resolved - including potholes, congestion, speeding and other safety concerns. I want to pull together a complete map of all the issues we are facing, and where, so that I can raise these with the road authorities. Fill it out at www.davidjohnston.org.uk/RoadsSurvey.

Now that I am the Minister for Children, Families and Wellbeing, one of the things I have responsibility for is overseeing the Government's big new expansion in childcare for parents. Once it is completed in Autumn 2025, it will give working parents 30 hours of free childcare every week from when their child is 9 months old until they start school. It is great be involved in delivering this exciting new policy and you can see exactly what you're eligible for at www.childcarechoices.gov.uk

It is also great that the Prime Minister has successfully delivered on his promise to halve inflation by the end of the year. It involved hard decisions and discipline, but it is right that we focused on this as inflation eats away at the pound in your pocket and has had negative effects on both prices and interest rates.

DISTRICT COUNCIL REPORT



Dear all,

Free Christmas Parking days – Abingdon, Wantage, and Faringson

In order to encourage people to visit the independent shops in our local towns for Christmas gifts and support local businesses, drivers can park for free in local car parks on the following Saturdays:

Abingdon: 2, 9 and 16 December
Faringdon: 2, 9 and 16 December
Wantage: 9, 16 and 23 December

On the selected days there's no need to display a ticket, however maximum stay times still apply in specific car parks. The car park machines will also indicate free parking.

Waste vehicles

There have been some articles in local papers about South and Vale buying eight diesel bin lorries. I thought I should pass on what's happened.

The fleet of waste vehicles is reaching the end of life, and the contract for waste services with Biffa is up for negotiation/end/re-let/whatever the decision will be (obviously all commercial, so I don't necessarily know and if I did, wouldn't be in a position to say much). A small number of them needed replacement urgently. Electric vehicles would be the first choice, but after trials, they weren't suitable (other than for food waste, so that one IS electric).

The most cost-effective way forwards was for us to purchase these eight and Biffa are leasing them from us. This also gives us control over the replacement cycle so we can jump onto the options of using EVs or alternative fuels vehicles when they do become available/practical (albeit the chances of this within the life of these vehicles is unfortunately not high).

New Joint Local Plan

The second round of consultation is about to be launched on developing the new Joint Local Plan to 2041. Remember: this Plan provides the legislative underpinning for decisions on planning applications, sets out how and where new developments should happen, sets standards for carbon and energy efficiency, and guides infrastructure needs across both districts.

This consultation will ask for your thoughts on proposed approaches across a bunch of policy areas (including community infrastructure and transport needs, affordable housing, protecting and enhancing local heritage and landscapes, and nature recovery).

Proposals include reduction of the number of new houses needed each year (whilst rebalancing to *increase* the number of affordable houses), increase biodiversity, and improve minimum standards on water and energy efficiency, and more.)

The consultation will launch in January, but you can get a sneak preview of the materials, as they'll be put in front of Joint Scrutiny on the 27th of November (I'll be very interested, as I'm on this particular committee). Details are here:

SESRO (Reservoir) Update

Thames Water have conducted a bunch of local "engagement sessions" recently, during which they appeared to imply things would be going faster and were more or less a done deal.*

This is not correct. When I pressed them during one such session, pointing out a swathe of answers yet to be given on floodplain encroachment, dam-breach analysis and risk details, costings, carbon calculations, microclimate issues (radiative fogs sweeping down over the A34), the effects of flexing 150 megatonnes of water on and off the clay floor of the Vale, no details on any way of mitigating their own flagged-up issues with Intrusive Non-Native Species that would otherwise require a total prohibition of any recreational use, etc), they then said it was very early days. That they would expect to address this later.

The Development Consent Order process they have mentioned in these sessions is not as straightforward as implied, either, and would require FULL answers before it could go ahead. There are a number of planning hurdles they have to jump that they have glossed over, and we will be acting upon these (without, of course, prejudging or prejudicing them, as that would render our interventions powerless). Should they manage to push a DCO through incorrectly, it would be subject to Judicial Review.

Their arguments against the Severn-Thames Transfer remain weak and inconsistent. It all seems down to the fact that they would not directly control the water coming into the region – an issue that can be simply addressed by stronger governance and regulation. That *is* something we can press on.

We are introducing a motion in the next Council meeting addressing our concerns (and including a request for an all-Party meeting with the Secretary of State to discuss our concerns and requesting a pause on the programme until addressed.) This may well, of course, be refused (although I've learned to be less cynical about such things over my time as Councillor, having seen more effectiveness than I'd previously assumed), but it will at the very least add to a body of material to be presented during the overall planning process and highlight the specifics above.

Cost of Living

Whilst the inflation rate has, thankfully, dropped somewhat, wages still have a long way to go to catch up with the (still inflating – albeit a bit slower) cost of living. As the cold weather bites, the <u>Cost of Living crisis</u> will bite harder.



PARISH COUNCIL REPORT



Parish Council Report

The Council met on 14th November

Walnut Meadows

This is a case of two steps forward and 1 and 3/4 steps back. Planning conditions require that the Parish Council (PC) undertake an archaeological survey of the strip of land on the site designated for the sports facilities. We had hoped that work on this would begin in November. However, despite repeated requests, Miller Homes have refused to allow access to the site before the land is transferred to the Parish Council. We are hoping that work will now commence in January. The transfer of the sports facility land to the PC has been delayed due to queries about potential liabilities relating to roads maintenance. Some key roads, including Chestnut Drive are due to be adopted by Oxfordshire County Council, however further work is required by Miller Homes to bring these roads up to standard. Progress on this appears to have stalled as OCC Highways have no staff to progress the matter with no officer currently assigned to the project.

The PC has requested that Miller Homes complete the landscaping work on the sports pitch area and have been assured that this will be completed before Christmas.

Manor Farm

The PC have chased CALA for an update on the remedial issues required to be undertaken on the public open space following our meeting with them in July. We will continue to try to get this work completed.

Traffic calming

As reported last month, we are awaiting a report from OCC on their recommendations for traffic calming measures as set out in the Neighbourhood Development plan.

You can tell from the tone of this that a lot of time is currently being spent chasing OCC and housing developers!

Burial ground

A notice board is to be erected in the burial ground. This will contain information about the rules and regulations for the site. Please note that no plastic, (including plastic flowers) are allowed in the burial ground.

We have had some of the area to the south of the burial ground cleared, but there is still some further work to clear stumps from the ground. This will be done by the village caretaker

<u>Defibrillator</u>

The PC is exploring possible locations in the centre of the village for a 2nd defibrillator to be installed.



What we're baffled about is WHY this is happening, so if anyone can give clues, PLEASE DO let us know! The C'tee has even considered offering a small reward for info leading to a successful prosecution.
