

GARD – GROUP AGAINST RESERVOIR DEVELOPMENT

Recent News

The recent news that the Secretary of State, Steven Reed, has approved Thames Water's Resource Management Plan with SESRO at the centre is greeted with astonishment and deep resentment.

Advice Overruled

The Secretary of State has overruled his Environment Agency advice that Thames Water's plans should be rejected because of concerns about the reservoir's resilience to drought and lack of proof that it provides the best value for money.

Oxford County Council, the Vale District Council and Abingdon Town Council all responded with GARD and residents, expressing strong opposition to Thames Water's latest consultation. It is shameful that a week later, before analysis of the results, the scheme which includes the reservoir has been progressed to the next stage.

Public Inquiry

The Environment Agency had advised on the need for public scrutiny. A Public Inquiry, called for by GARD, reiterated recently by MPs Olly Glover and Layla Moran, is the only way of getting at the truth when confronted by an organisation with such a poor track record of openness as Thames Water. The Secretary of State has missed the opportunity to establish the facts and remove unresolved issues which remain on cost, construction environmental damage, post-construction safety, flooding hazards and crucially, if it is actually needed at all. Leaking more than twice the maximum supply of this Reservoir, Thames Water must also be held to account to reduce their leak rate to at least industry average.

Campaign Continues

This is certainly not the end of the road. GARD will continue its campaign against this monstrosity. The Reservoir needs final approval at Development Consent Order proceedings in 2026, and we will be contesting this project all the way. We are working to establish our next steps.

This reservoir remains the least drought resilient, longest delivery-time, most environmentally damaging and disruptive 'solution' to the coming water shortages in the south-east.

A high-risk construction like this is not the sort of project to be entrusted to a company which might not survive beyond next Spring.

Preventing keyless car theft

Dear Resident

Don't let thieves get an easy ride. Follow these rules to protect your keyless vehicle from thieves.

Cars with keyless entry unlock automatically when the key comes within a short distance of the car. This can be from inside a pocket or bag. If you have to push a button on your car key to open your car, you don't have keyless entry.


Keyless car theft or 'relay theft' is when a device is used to fool the car into thinking the key is close by. This unlocks the car and starts the ignition.

Thieves only need to be within a few metres of your car key to capture the signal, even if it's inside your home. This means that even if your car and home are secure, thieves can still unlock, start and steal your car.

How to protect your keyless entry car:

- When at home keep your car key (and the spare) well away from the car.
- Put the keys in a screened or signal-blocking pouch, such as a Faraday Bag and check if the bag or pouch is still working every few months.
- Reprogramme your keys if you buy a second hand car.
- Turn off wireless signals on your fob when it's not being used.

COUNTY COUNCIL REPORT - Peter Stevens

Hi all,

it is with pleasure that I write my first column for the monthly magazine. I apologise upfront for the late start – I was elected councillor back at the end of June, and then promptly went on holiday with my family, followed by the normal summer holidays through to the end of August, which has meant that I am only really coming up to speed now in September. However, I have now attended the council meetings for all of the six parishes in my division, as well as sitting on two full county councils and three committees that scrutinise council work. Public life as a councillor is quite different from my normal work, lots of wordy reports to read and more formalities – but more formal for a good reason to ensure everyone gets their democratic say, so worthwhile and rewarding.

News

In terms of news, we are waiting to hear about the new HIF road and bridge across the Thames in between Appleford and Sutton Courtenay. I spent a lot of time over the summer trying my best to help resolve issues with school buses which have faced considerable challenges over the holidays to prepare for the new school year. I visited the massive landfill site in between the two villages, where I saw what action is being taken to prevent bad smells re-occurring from leachate problems over the past year, and I have asked to visit the waste transfer site there to find out what they are doing to minimise their impact on us.

Planning

I am trying to support the new pavilion for the football club at Milton through planning difficulties. I will be trained on the legalities of planning before being allowed to join the county planning committee in November, where I will then scrutinise plans for the landfill site, gravel pits, waste transfer stations, the HIF road, and other infrastructure and large new local developments, to try to get the best deal for local residents and long-term outcomes for communities.

Reservoir

At county, district, and parish level, we objected to Thames Water and their proposed SESRO mega reservoir, and I continue to feed into the consultation to improve their strategic plans for the Thames, improving resilience to flooding, harnessing flood waters, stopping leaks, stopping sewage spills, and improving water recycling, as well as safe-guarding water supplies.

Road surfaces

This week, I am going to meet the county highways team at Marcham to discuss improving the roads, and to find out what steps they are taking to make the repairs to pot-holes last longer and be more resilient to the climate changes increasing their prevalence.

I am also being briefed on the master plan to redevelop the Dalton barracks next to Abingdon, and will find out more about the new Joint Local Plan ahead of next month.

More next month, until then enjoy the last of the summer sun,

DISTRICT COUNCIL REPORT



Dear all.

Joint Local Plan

As I write, at a meeting last night, the Joint Local Plan (with South Oxfordshire) was approved unanimously in Council.

This has come after a lengthy and exhaustive process, in which we were given a series of requirements to meet for future development in the Vale (which were non-negotiable from Government) and we aimed to put them into the best possible outcome we could get.

We also aimed for the greatest transparency (to the point where you may have become sick of all the "please comment on the Joint Local Plan proposal" requests) and the maximum possible feedback from residents. This, of course, has to be weighed up between responses, but I think the team did pretty well.

It's long been my firm belief that where development happens and/or is needed, giving people affected by it the maximum control over what goes where and what infrastructure goes with it is crucial. This is why the way the Neighbourhood Development Plans being bypassed by developers and that bypassing being supported by Government legislation has been so damaging.

The new Local Plan writes in greater support and safeguards around Neighbourhood Development Plans. We do, though, also need much stronger powers and authority for planning enforcement to drive the required infrastructure elements through. In addition, we've written in the requirement for 40% affordable housing, so hopefully residents and their families can get a look in.

As well as infrastructure, increased affordable housing, and stronger safeguards on NDPs, environmental protection and safeguarding have been woven in throughout. There are areas where we'd have liked to go further, but we still have to get it approved through the Government inspection process, and we're probably as far along most of those limbs as we can get away with.

A crucial reason for accelerating this through is that it sets the agreed housing targets <u>before</u> any changes come from Central Government. This may have to be changed in future, but it starts us off on the old targets.

Reservoir

In a surprise move, the new Secretary of State signed off Thames Water's Water Resources Management Plan, despite advice from the Environment Agency not to do so, and a number of outstanding requests to see and speak to him about it (from ourselves, amongst others). This "establishes the need" for the reservoir, but, crucially, doesn't act to approve it. Although Thames Water seem to be trying to give the impression that it does

There are numerous hurdles yet to jump through, and we have written again to the Secretary of State, urgently asking for a discussion. I know that our new MP, Olly Glover, has done the same, asking to meet him as well and for us at Vale, for OCC, and for GARD to be involved. No response has yet been received.

Thames Water still haven't given answers to all of the critical questions — especially on safety (dam-break), and flooding, which have been further reinforced by the recent floods in Europe. Such extreme events are likely to become more common, which underlines the urgency of this. When experienced and independent dam engineers and reservoir specialists find this alarming, I think it MUST be addressed up front. This is not to mention:

- The issues on fantasy costings and timelines (if you believe it'll come in at their £2bn or so and be in operation by 2040, I've got numerous bridges to sell you...)
- How they propose to refill the reservoir in prolonged droughts (which is the only scenario where they can get the numbers to remotely justify it – but can't find a way to refill it when it runs dry partway through, as the Thames is the most water-stressed river in the country)
- The use of inaccurate and wholly overblown population projections (the ONS have already disproven their projections)
- And why they've completely ignored the National Infrastructure Commission's recommendations strongly urging water transfers and leakage reduction first and foremost.

Instead of the above, they've devoted significant amounts of time and money to creating fantasy images and virtual reality simulations of something that they know and accept would not resemble what is produced.

The cynic in me can't help but suspect that the commercial issues around the entire water sector in general and Thames Water in particular might be related to this unexpected and controversial sign-off by the Secretary of State. Hopefully that's just me being too cynical.

Community Safety Partnership

Ourselves and South Oxfordshire work with Thames Valley Police and Oxfordshire County Council in a Community Safety Partnership — aiming to try to help deal with Anti-Social Behaviour (ASB) and crime. There can be "easy wins" by engaging with the causes of ASB and crime early on, and with taking steps to support vulnerable people, especially when out and about.

These include providing advice on targeting areas prone to ASB and crime, providing things to do for youngsters, providing independent mediation services to reduce domestic abuse, raising awareness of child exploitation, supporting places such as shops, libraries, community, and leisure centres to become "Safe Places" where people can ask for help (look for stickers in the windows for this). I confess I was sceptical about the effectiveness of these at first, but after going through in depth on the Joint Scrutiny Committee, I've become quite a fan. It seems to be one of the best "bang for the buck" interventions in the field. They have a recent report here: https://democratic.whitehorsedc.gov.uk/documents/s61316/Joi



PARISH COUNCIL REPORT



The Parish Council met on September 10th.

Walnut Meadows

An archeological survey of the site designated for the sports area took place between February and April of this year. The results showed nothing that would alter the planned development of the site. However, they provided evidence that the immediate and surrounding landscape was extensively settled and exploited during the later prehistoric and Roman period.

Roman pottery and animal bones were recovered dating to the 2nd century. In total 270 pottery shards, 106 fragments of animal remains and 11 fragments of worked stone were found. These included 76 shards of handmade pottery from prehistoric to the Roman period and 192 shards of wheel made pottery. The animal bones include those of equine nature, cattle, possibly red deer, pigs, sheep, goats and dogs. Oxfordshire County Council has asked for a further analysis of the pottery remains.

A meeting with our contractor, Agripower, has been held regarding the sports pitches. The best estimate is that the sports pitch development may not be complete until September 2025. Sadly, substantial further building rubbish has even found on site which will cost in the region of £9000 to remove. The PC has contacted the enforcement team from the District Council to try and hold Miller Homes to account (again).

The planning application for the MUGAs (multi- use games area) has been submitted.

Traffic calming

The PC is waiting for the OCC contractor Milestone to get back to us with further plans for the crossings on the High Street and Abingdon Road outside Walnut Meadow and the extension of the pavement to the south of the High Street

Sutton Wick Pond

We are currently seeking quotes for the clean-up and restoration of Sutton Wick Pond.

The planned reservoir

The PC noted that despite a vast number of objections to the reservoir, the Secretary of State has signed off Thames Water's water management plan that includes plans for the reservoir. The Parish Council was one of the bodies that submitted their objections. This document can be seen on the Parish Council website.

Michaelmas and Runaway fairs



The Michaelmas and Runaway fairs take place each year in October and the Michaelmas fair is reputed to be the longest street fair in Europe.

When are the fairs held?

By law, the Michaelmas fair must take place annually on the Monday and Tuesday falling first before the 11 October in the centre of Abingdon-on-Thames, covering Ock Street, High Street and the Market Place.

Ancient origins

The fairs began as a way to hire labour in the period after the Black Death in 1348, when the population fell by upwards of 40%, giving workers more power to seek work elsewhere. Skilled workers would carry the tools of their trade over their shoulder, while unskilled workers would carry a mop instead, which is why the fair is sometimes known as the 'mop fair'.

The Runaway Fair takes place a week after the Michaelmas fair and was so named because it was a chance for anyone who had made a mistake and started work with a master who was perhaps cruel or untrustworthy to literally run away and find another place to work.
