## **Drayton Hall News - Closure Shock?!**

It was my privilege to be able to attend the **50th** anniversary celebration of the Village Hall's creation last night (mid-May).

I was attending in my role as the **Parish Council liaison person** with the Hall C'tee. Imagine therefore, what a lovely surprise, when halfway through the agenda, sparkling wine corks were popped, and glasses appeared with sausage rolls. If there's anything as good as sparkling wine, it's cake, and sure enough, a celebration cake, baked and served by the secretary, was produced.

It didn't take long for the evening to turn into quite a riotous occasion. I seem to remember at one point asking Tony if he'd like to sit on my lap; he gallantly said that as I'm more used to balancing the weight of a harp (my day job), he'd better decline for both our sakes!

I wish our PC meetings were like this, but I'm sure there's some boring statute that states that no refreshments must be partaken of during government meetings. Shame!

Now, without further pre-amble, the purpose of my article is to let the village know that we are in a crisis situation, hence that 'Closed' picture!

With just a couple of exceptions, the Village Hall C'tee are well over eighty, and from the look of some of them, probably ninety. There's only so long that gallant, public-spirited, self-sacrificing people can carry on their roles in serving our community, illness has taken its toll, and the burden has become too much.

They have tried to communicate this to the community before, but the time has come when enough is enough. Unless we can recruit new members to run the Village Hall Committee, the place will have to close down, because the current situation is untenable (and the PC is unlikely to be able to take it on).

As many of you know, if somebody is willing to do a job, we tend not only to rely on them to do it, but also to take it for granted that they will continue doing it, because that's what they do. We are perfectly happy to let them carry on, because we have come to expect it of them!

Unfortunately, the time for change has come, and drastic action needs to be taken.

So, do YOU think you could help? The committee needs recruits to run the Hall, by overseeing maintenance and taking bookings and payments. For this, they need a new bookings secretary, a new treasurer, a new caretaker, and in the fullness of time, once we know who volunteers, a new Chairman.

It really isn't so onerous: meetings are held once every two months, for around an hour & a half. There's real scope for new ideas and roles will be what you make of them (NB the bookings & treasurer roles, and a willing someone for 'odd jobs' do inevitably take more time!).

→ To add a little more context to Pervin's appeal for Hall help, one topic greatly disappointing for the C'tee is that of 'S106' funding. That's a prescribed method by which developers (eg of the village's new estates) pay some funds for improvements (for PC & Hall, etc).

The contracts (per estate) were drawn up to allocate specified amounts, the Vale Council has an officer to verify the applications and issue the amounts.

BUT – it seems that extra conditions are being imposed (we're not clear from an elected or paid part of the Council), not defined in the original contracts, and though there are ongoing discussions, so far we have not been able to get satisfactory answers to what seem simple questions. I gather the PC have had similar issues?

For example 'maintenance' is we hear NOT allowed, but old Halls need plenty, especially with the increased usage from the larger population resulting from . . those estates!

One contract specifically refers to 'maintenance'! Hence we really don't need the aggravation! [TH]

## From the DAMASCUS Ministry Team

#### Dear Friends,

On the 29th June the church remembers two important people from its history - **St. Peter and St. Paul**. In the church calendar they are celebrated on the same day. This is because it is believed they were both killed on that date, Peter in around 64AD and Paul a few years later in around 67AD. Both were killed for their faith and this, along with the influence they have had on the church over the centuries, is why they are remembered. Two of the churches in our parish are named after them – **St. Peter's** in Drayton and **St. Peter** and **St. Paul** in Appleford – as are many other churches around the country and the world.

Both Peter and Paul understood the importance of telling people about Jesus, and the words and stories written by them and about them in the Bible teach us many things. One of the most striking things about what is written is how it contains details of the mistakes they both made. So much so that Paul, in one of his letters, even criticises Peter for a mistake he is making. Examples like this show us that Peter and Paul were not perfect, and this helps to remind us that neither are we. It is how we respond to the mistakes we make that is most important.

This is often in contrast to what society tells us today. Whether it is the picture-perfect lives we see on social media or the fear that a genuine error could lead to some sort of penalty, we are frequently made to feel that we cannot get things wrong. What Peter and Paul show us is that it is acceptable to fail as God forgives and loves us even when our mistakes are talked about some 2000 years later!

To hear more about this, <u>please join us</u> at 4pm on June 29th at St Peter's Drayton, a **special service** for the <u>whole DAMASCUS</u> <u>parish</u> where I shall be celebrating communion for the first time after being priested at Dorchester Abbey that morning.

We had another amazing meeting with Jack Matthews (of **Matthews and Sons**, our local family run florists from Sutton Courtenay). But, before I go into that, **we would like to welcome** a new member to our group, and two visitors from the now closed Sutton group. We hope they all felt welcome and will come again.

The subject of the meeting was **the assembly of a hanging basket**. Starting with the basket, he uses wire type, lining starts with moss and a saucer sized circle of plastic, to form a reservoir for water for when the basket is completed.

Fill the basket with compost up to halfway and then thread the first layer of plants, to hang down, through the sides. A solid food was added and compost to fill to the top. More trailers and upright plants were placed round the outer edge and geraniums in the centre completed the display. He recommended the flowers be removed to allow establishment of the basket, and cuttings can also be taken from some of the plants he used.


Jack stressed that the plants should be well soaked before planting and allow two weeks to settle before displaying. The basket was raffled and one lucky member won it.



## **Next PC Meeting**

Now **Monday** evenings (2nd of month so next it's June 9th, in the Caudwell Day Centre (Gravel Lane), 7pm. All residents are welcome to attend, and raise issues within the public participation item early in the meeting.

The agenda is published on the PC website prior to NB Parking IS a bit limited near the CDC, so if you attend, & can walk or bike there, please do?!

#### The Council met on May 12th >>>

From now on the PC will normally meet on the 2nd Monday of every month.

And we are delighted to welcome our 3 new Councillors Elizabeth Sheppard, Andrew Cherriman and Will Brewer.

#### Walnut Meadows

The implementation of the sports pitches and drainage started on 7th May with the removal of more buried waste from the pitch area. The contractor is also implementing the surface water drainage plans for the MUGA, Pavilion and Car Park areas.

The MUGA contractor has confirmed the start date for the construction of the Multi Use Games Area as 19th May. Work will last for 6-8 weeks with a further 4 weeks for the asphalt to harden before line painting can be carried out.

#### Manor Farm

As reported last month, Cala's contractors carried out further spraying for hemlock on areas of the proposed public open space despite the Parish Council having addressed this and gained agreement that there would be no further blanket spraying. We have now discussed this again with the District Council who have been assured by CALA that any remaining hemlock will be hand pulled and only spot sprayed if absolutely necessary. The area has now been rotavated and wildflower seeds sown.

## Traffic Calming

The proposals for Drayton were approved at the Oxfordshire County Council meeting on 27th March. A safety audit is being undertaken following public feedback. Detailed designs will then be completed. It is anticipated that works will be completed this year. This will consist of work at the junction of Walnut Meadows and Abingdon Road and the installation of a pedestrian crossing on the High Street.

We have requested that the Vehicle Activated sign on the High Street is replaced and also that work is done on the other two signs at the Steventon Road end of the village (sign is well in the 30 mph limit, faint and covered with a tree branch) and on the Abingdon Road (sign is set at 30 mph but is very close to the start of the 20 mph zone).

I can only apologise to the village for the length of time it has taken to sort out the VA Signs. The PC has been requesting action for a few years now!

#### **Footpaths**

As walkers and cyclists will be aware, work to refurbish Bridleway 8 has now been completed. The next path to undergo refurbishment will be a section of Bridleway 29 (past the scrap yard) where it joins onto Bridleway 8.

#### New Defibrillator!!

. . . has been installed in the **bus shelter next to Vickerys**.



## After Walking TO Abingdon, Walking BACK!

In the May issue of the Chronicle I gave directions on how to walk to Abingdon without having to go anywhere near that dreadful B4017. To get back you could simply retrace your steps [Ed:- or there's that handy bus that runs quite frequently these days?!] but here's a variation which, for reasons that will become clear, I choose to call the Heritage Route.

Starting from the Market Square, walk down East St Helen's Street and follow the road round the church, across the Iron Bridge into Wilsham Road - and keep going.

Eventually you come to a short path that takes you towards Abingdon Marina, but you carry on down Peepo-Day Lane, with fishing lakes on your left and sports fields, the sewage works and gravel extraction on your right. Turn right up the long, straight, concrete road. All this will be familiar to anyone who took the route I recommended in walking to Abingdon.

Now we come to the variation. Soon after you turn left into Gypsy Lane you will see a footpath sign on the right, pointing diagonally across the field. Take it but don't stray from the path because the field is usually under cultivation.

Sutton Wick is in sight but before you get there you will meet another path crossing in front of you, where you turn right. After a short distance you go through a kissing gate at a corner of the field, and here you come across the Hidden Heritage.

At first sight the path leads through tall bushes on either side, but look again at those on the right. Hidden by the undergrowth you will find \*\*\*cars, vans and trucks that haven't moved in decades; brambles grow over and through them in rampant profusion. There is a Wavy Line lorry (remember them?) and others eroded beyond all recognition. They may no longer have a use for humans but all have found a new purpose in providing shelter for a wide variety of wildlife. This stretch is also a good place to come at blackberry-picking time but remember - it is private property, so keep to the path.

The path emerges into Sutton Wick, opposite the delightful duck pond. Turn towards Drayton, taking the right fork into our equally delightful Millennium Green. I was involved in its concept and the way it has turned out is always a pleasure to me. Take the path into Henleys Lane and cross into the Manor Farm estate; wend your way through it until you come to Gravel Lane, etc.

In another issue of the Chronicle I hope to introduce you to the River Route. It's a good bit longer but full of interest and refreshments\*\* are available along the way [\*\*Ed:- that's more like it!]. More later.

#### Joint Local Plan

I've gone on about the planning regulations and the essential status of the Joint Local Plan a lot in the past; it's now entering the phase where the Planning Inspectors carry out **public hearings** to ensure it's sound and in accordance with legal and procedural requirements. With the

amount of work that's gone into it, it had better be. After all, it's the key element in our holding on to whatever level of planning power we've been left by decades of changes to planning legislation.

The first week of hearing dates will cover the following topics:-

<u>Tues 3 June</u>: Matter 1 – Procedural and Legal Requirements followed by Matter 2 – The Duty to Co-operate

Weds 4 June: Matter 3 – The Housing Target/Requirement

Thurs 5 June: Matter 4 – The Employment Land Requirement

The hearing sessions will be held in public at Bee House on Milton Park, and anyone can attend in person to watch (subject to venue capacity). The sessions will also be available to watch online via a livestream from Bee House. More details on the JLP here: https://www.southandvale.gov.uk/joint-local-plan-2041-examination/

As a very brief aside in the planning area, and avoiding any comment on the political aspects, I did happen to see a public announcement that the new administration in Lincolnshire will be automatically refusing any solar farm planning applications, and I 'facepalmed'. If I were a solar farm developer, I'd be making a beeline for Lincolnshire now. From all I've written on the subject over the years, you may have an intuitive feel of why that's the case by now. It's because if a planning application refusal (or approval, for that matter) can be deemed "predetermined" by the Planning Committee, it will nearautomatically be overruled at appeal, and with costs awarded against the Local Authority, so the appeal would be free for the developer. Announcing in the national press that you're determined against all such developments is as clear a predetermination as possible, so they've just announced open season for developers in that area.

In addition, if an Authority loses too many appeals (I believe 10% is the threshold), they have their planning powers removed (see https://www.bbc.co.uk/news/articles/c4grp83zgj6o -- a recent example story about Wiltshire).

#### Splash Pads in Abbey Meadow

The splash pads at Abbey Meadow in Abingdon and Wantage Memorial Gardens will open just in time for the bank holiday weekend at the end of May.

The splash pad at Abbey Meadow will open daily, while the kiosk will be open only at weekends until the outdoor pool opens on 19th July. After that, the kiosk, splash pad and outdoor pool will be available every day until 7th September.

<u>Throughout the summer</u>, the council's Active Communities team will also host a variety of events, including community walks, free outdoor community park fitness sessions (designed for those new to exercise or who have been inactive for some time) and football sessions.

## Oxford Flood Alleviation Scheme

**Finally some good news** re flooding. The Government have confirmed the Oxford Flood Alleviation Scheme's Compulsory Purchase Order, and OCC have granted planning permission. This will cause some disruption as they put it into effect, it will involve creating a new stream, grazing pasture, and gently sloping wetland about 3 miles long, starting just north of Botley Road and passing under the A423 Kennington Railway Bridge (Southern by-pass) to the south before re-joining the River Thames. **It should considerably reduce flood risk** to Oxford, a bunch of local roads, the railway, and the utilities and services in the area (which has knock-on effects as far out as us).

#### **Bat Surveys by Thames Water**

Thames Water will be continuing their survey work in the proposed SESRO area (remember - it's not yet approved, no matter the impression TW would like to give), and they have to check out bat **populations**. They're going to be using both manual and static temporary radio antennas (which look like this picture).



[Ed's Note:- ANYONE who's seen TW's ludicrous behaviour over the years will know they don't have to look far for 'batty'!]

# Using tech to fight retail crime: Disc app now used by over 1,500 businesses

The retail crime reporting app was rolled out a year ago free of charge, funded by the Police and Crime Commissioner.

<u>D</u>ISC is a crime information-sharing system that allows for businesses and others to be aware of criminal activity in their communities, view galleries of offenders, submit reports of incidents and act as an alternative to 101 for reporting non-emergency crimes. It also enables communities to manage their business crime reduction schemes efficiently and effectively. A year since its launch, 1563 businesses have signed up and 1758 incidents have now been registered.

Thames Valley Police and Crime Commissioner **Matthew Barber** said: "This app has been a key part of my retail crime strategy. I encourage businesses to join and to make full use of the app so more criminals can be brought to justice and retail staff can be protected. Maximising member participation is essential for successful crime reduction schemes."

Disc is available, free of charge, to businesses in the Thames Valley area, it can be used for retail, night-time economy or Antisocial behaviour (ASB) schemes. The information is shared with Thames Valley Police and supports the use of enforcement action against offenders as well as increasing in shoplifting convictions.

## WESTMINSTER VIEW



Our (new) MP (Didcot & Wantage) is Olly Glover (Lib Dem).

In recent weeks, I've been focused on Planning. I was appointed to the Planning and Infrastructure Bill C'tee, where MPs from various parties scrutinise this new government legislation. We are reviewing

the bill line by line, suggesting improvements before it returns to the Commons. Experts and charities have provided evidence, and I have advocated for amendments to protect nature, ensure genuinely affordable housing with necessary infrastructure, and introduce solar panels above car parks. The committee debated the vital role of planning committees in ensuring transparency and community engagement.

While the Govt may not adopt many amendments, we continue **pushing for improvements**, and it is important that the Ministers championing the Bill hear the full range of concerns about it.

I also led my first Westminster Hall debate, championing walking and cycling for journeys to school, and urging its prioritisation in the Road Safety Strategy. I raised local examples, including a safe crossing over the A415 in Culham for Europa School students, and improvements to the walking and cycling path there, and a much-delayed walking and cycling bridge project over the A34 in Milton, to link Milton Heights with Milton Park and Milton Village. We discussed safety concerns like pavement parking forcing wheelchairs and buggies onto the road and the need for investment in rural cycle and footpaths. Minister Lillian Greenwood is set to visit a local school to observe Bikeability training, which boosts children's confidence in cycling to school.

Recent Westminster activities include meeting Lord Vallance to discuss concerns that our local area may not benefit from the proposed 'Oxford to Cambridge Growth Corridor', and summing up a debate on St George's Day. I also took part in a debate on estate management fees affecting new residents, and raised questions with ministers on various local concerns, including export license processing for small businesses, stalking protections, transgender rights, and the lack of coordination in roadworks.

Regarding the **mega-reservoir**, a High Court hearing on 24th and 25th June will determine whether a Judicial Review into the Government's decision to approve Thames Water's plans for the Abingdon Reservoir without a Public Inquiry should proceed. I have secured a meeting with Emma Hardy, Minister for Water and Flooding, to **ensure the government fully understands the community's concerns** about this major infrastructure project.

The Planning and Infrastructure Bill Committee has kept me in Westminster more than I'd like, but I was glad to meet local residents at my advice surgeries, visit Grove GP practices, celebrate VE Day in Wantage, and visit Linda Benton's art exhibition championing beautiful and old local trees in Didcot and East Hagbourne.

Alongside my regular appointment-based surgeries, I am planning drop-in sessions in some villages this summer – look out for details of the dates and times. In the meantime, feel free to contact me. **Olly**

## HAY FEVER??

Hay fever can be annoying at the best of times. But this year, many people are reporting their usual symptoms are worse than ever before — with their normal go-to remedies doing little to provide relief.

**Here's what you can do** if you're finding that nothing seems to be helping your itchy eyes, sneezing and runny nose this year.

There are several reasons why hay fever is so bad right now. In the UK, 2025's unusually dry and warm spring has worsened conditions, leading to earlier and more intense tree pollen release. Birch pollen, which affects around 25% of UK hay fever sufferers, peaked sharply this year due to the high temperatures and low rainfall – two factors which increase pollen production and dispersal. The lack of rain has also prevented pollen from being cleared from the air, prolonging exposure and severity.

Another issue is timing. For full relief from hay fever symptoms, allergy medicines (especially steroid nasal sprays) should be started one to two weeks before pollen appears. You can also develop new sensitivities, even as an adult. Pollen that didn't bother you years ago might start causing symptoms now. Grass and birch pollen are among the most common types of seasonal pollen that start bothering people in adulthood.

#### **Managing symptoms**

If you're finding allergy pills alone just aren't cutting it this year, the best thing you can do to reduce symptoms is **cut your pollen exposure** wherever possible.

Before going outdoors, **check the local pollen forecast**. Avoid exercising outside during peak pollen hours (usually mid-morning on dry, windy days). If you do go **outside**, wear a face mask (such as an N95 mask) when pollen counts are high. After coming inside, remove your shoes at the door, change your clothes and take a shower to wash off pollen.

Inside, you can use a HEPA air purifier or high-MERV filters in your heating or cooling system. These will capture airborne pollen particles, which may help to reduce the severity of your symptoms during high-pollen seasons. On high-pollen days, keep windows and doors closed. You might also want to vacuum with a HEPA-filter vacuum and wash bedding often to remove any pollen. While these steps won't cure allergies, they can sharply reduce your total exposure. This gives medications a better chance to work.

**Allergy tablets** work best when taken daily and pre-emptively, ideally before peak exposure each morning.

**Nasal steroid sprays** are often more effective than antihistamines for nasal congestion. These should be started one to two weeks before the allergy season begins and used consistently.

Allergy wipes and saline nasal rinses may also help reduce pollen exposure – though evidence of their benefit have only been shown in small studies, so larger, high-quality trials confirming their effectiveness are still needed.

#### Longer-term fixes

When symptoms stay severe, **allergy immunotherapy** – which helps desensitise a hay fever sufferer to pollen – can help. This works like an allergy "vaccine". You receive tiny, gradually increasing doses of your specific allergen either by regular injection or as a daily under-the-tongue tablet or drop. This trains your immune system to tolerate the pollen and shifts your immune response by making your body better able to block allergens while simultaneously dampening the allergic response.

In one study, around **90% of patients** who underwent a full course of immunotherapy had **major relief from symptoms** – and this effect often lasted many years. The trade-off with immunotherapy is commitment: a typical course lasts 3–5 years under a specialist's guidance. But for **people with chronic hay fever**, immunotherapy can dramatically improve their quality of life. [courtesy of 'TheConversation.com' newsletter]

Also that month 'Marmite' star James Blunt was at #1 with "You're Beautiful".

Back to **1995** – **Robson & Jerome** had quite a while at #1 with 'Unchained Melody', the biggest selling single of the year.

**40** years ago (REALLY so long?!) Paul Hardcastle had just been #1 with the catchy 'N-n-Nineteen', keeping out Katrina & the Waves ('Walking on Sunshine') and Duran Duran's Bond-theme ('View to a Kill'). Sister Sledge also hit #1 ('Frankie'), followed by Jennifer Rush ('Power of Love').

Just below them were Fine Young Cannibals ('Johnny Come Home'), Bruce Springsteen ('I'm on Fire/Born in the USA'), & Dire Straits ('Money for Nothing'), with soon to be at #1 the wonderful Eurythmics ('There Must be an Angel'), and Madonna with 'Into the Groove'. Quite a month!

FIFTY years ago (for real old-timers), we'd just had Windsor Davies & Don Estelle ('Whispering Grass') and the fantastic 10cc at #1 (I'm Not in Love), just edging out another iconic sound Judy Collins ('Send in the Clowns'). Also high in the charts were the Sensational Alex Harvey Band (their name, not my adjective, though they were OK!), with their version (& only top-10 hit) of the old Tom Jones (now Sir Tom!) hit 'Delilah' (very hard to not sing along if that one's on the radio?!).
